## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill proposes to add a Community EMT and Community Paramedic endorsement according to standards established by DHS or a medical director. As an extension of existing EMT and paramedic licensure, the Department will be able to modify its existing system to accommodate the added credential with a one-time cost of \$5,000 GPR. The Department will be required to develop a scope of practice, curriculum, and approval process, as well as assist registered EMS providers to update their service protocols and operational plans. To implement the endorsement, provide training, and maintain the standard of 60 days or less to process licenses, operational plans, and protocols, the Department would require an additional 1.0 FTE GPR Human Services Program Coordinator Senior at \$80,300 GPR, plus a one-time set-up cost of \$2,500.

It is assumed that the bill does not require the Department to offer Medicaid reimbursement for community paramedic services.

This bill has no fiscal impact on local public health departments.
