## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

SB 161 provides funding to support hospitals and clinics that provide training opportunities for advanced practice clinicians, defined as physician assistant advanced practice nurse. Under this bill, the Department would be required to distribute up to \$50,000 to a hospital or clinic, to a total of \$750,000 each fiscal year, from the appropriation under 20.435 (1) (fk), with preference given to rural programs. The grant would be used to create the education and infrastructure for new training opportunities for advanced practice clinicians, or to support costs associated with operating a clinical training program, such as books, tuition, living expense stipends, and preceptor costs. Grantees are expected to match the grant amount through their own funding sources.

In order to develop the application and manage the request for application process, as well as provide support to and oversee the grantees, the Department estimates the need for a 0.5 FTE Program and Policy Analyst-Advanced at a cost of \$40,900 GPR per year.
