Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2017 SB 206 would create a grant program for the purpose of connecting homeless individuals with permanent employment. The program would provide \$75,000 annually to a single municipality meeting certain conditions (e.g., the municipality must provide \$50,000 in matching funds). The proposed legislation provides an annual, GPR appropriation of \$75,000 under s. 20.505 (7) (ft), Stats., Employment Grants.

The Department's Supportive Housing unit currently administers several homelessness and special needs grant programs funded by federal and state resources, containing 4.0 FTE permanent positions. Given that the program involves a single grant award, the Department anticipates that the annual administration of the grant program can be accomplished with existing resources. The Department also anticipates that the one-time workload associated with setting up the program (e.g., updating website, developing application materials and evaluation criteria) can also be accomplished with existing resources.
