#### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill would change the fall turkey, gray (Hungarian) partridge, pheasant hunting and fisher trapping season. These seasons currently close on December 31. The bill sets them as open through the Sunday nearest January 6 (including the New Year's holiday weekend) and would statutorily prohibit variation.

The bill would change the archer deer season. The season currently closes Sunday nearest January 6 (including the New Year's holiday weekend) except for six metro areas (Green Bay, Hudson, La Crosse, Madison, Milwaukee, and Superior). The metro areas are currently open through January 31. The bill sets the archer deer season as open through the Sunday nearest January 6 for metro areas in addition to all other areas and would statutorily prohibit variation.

The department already administers a suite of different hunting and trapping season frameworks, issues related licenses and permits and enforces applicable hunting and trapping regulations. The only cost the department anticipates for this bill relates to the staff time required to revise administrative rules. Assuming an average wage of \$45 per hour including fringe benefits, one-time costs for these revisions are estimated at \$1,350 (30 hrs. x \$45).
