## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under this bill, a person who is on the federal "no fly" list is prohibited from possessing a firearm and is guilty of a Class G felony for violating the prohibition. This bill requires the Department of Justice to maintain an updated list of such persons and to check the list when conducting background checks related to handgun purchases or licenses to carry a concealed weapon.

District Attorneys indicated that this legislation could potentially increase their workloads by a small amount due to the complex nature of the offense and law enforcement needing guidance from the DA's office. Another prosecutor indicted he would not prosecute due to constitutional concerns. The fiscal impact of this legislation is indeterminate.

## **Long-Range Fiscal Implications**

The long-range fiscal implications of this legislation on district attorney's offices is indeterminate.
