Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under current law, the majority of Wisconsin voters must provide one of nine statutorily approved forms of photo ID such as a State of Wisconsin Driver License or ID card, U.S. Passport, or other form of existing forms of government identification. The proposed bill introduces an affidavit executed by the elector as a form of acceptable ID for an elector to receive a ballot in the State of Wisconsin. It is assumed that the Wisconsin Elections Commission (WEC) would be responsible for prescribing the process for the new affidavit option, for training municipal and county clerks on the process, as well as informing the public regarding the affidavit option.

It is assumed that the fiscal impact on the WEC to implement the AVR process would fall into the following four categories:

- 1) Train Municipal and County Clerks on the Affidavit Process Cost: \$1,344
- 2) IT Development Costs to Implement the Affidavit Process Cost: \$1,900
- Update and Develop Agency Resources Regarding the Affidavit Process Cost: \$1,344

The total estimated cost to implement the legislation is estimated to be \$4,588. Additional descriptions of these categories is provided below:

1) Train Municipal and County Clerks on the Affidavit Process:

It is assumed that the WEC will be responsible for training municipal and county clerks on the affidavit process. Training materials could include manuals, guidance documents and webinars. It is anticipated that WEC training staff would be required to dedicate an estimated 40 hours of time, at an average cost of \$33.60 per hour (\$25.85 wage + \$7.75 fringe) to create and update training materials for municipal and county clerks, for a total cost of \$1,344.

2) IT Development Costs to Implement the Affidavit Process:

It is assumed that the WEC would be responsible for modifying agency technology, such as the WisVote and MyVote systems and the electronic poll book system to accommodate the affidavit option. It is anticipated that WEC IT development staff would be required to dedicate an estimated 20 hours of time, at an average cost of \$95 per hour to include options for an affidavit as photo ID for voting, for a total cost of \$1,900.

3) Update and Develop Agency Resources to Include the Affidavit Process:

It is assumed that existing WEC agency resources, such as websites and voter outreach materials, would need to be updated to reference and explain the affidavit process. It is also assumed that the WEC would be responsible for creating new materials for the public that outline the process for obtaining and using an affidavit for voting purposes. It is anticipated that WEC program staff would be required to dedicate an estimated 40 hours, at an average cost of \$33.60 per hour (\$25.85 wage + \$7.75 fringe), to update and create agency resources and materials to include an affidavit as an option for identification for voting, for a total cost of \$1,344.
