Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill would preempt local governments from enacting or enforcing ordinances related to various employment matters.

The Department of Corrections (DOC) is not aware of any local ordinances affecting DOC that would be preempted by this bill. As such, DOC estimates that this bill would have no state fiscal impact on DOC.

DOC is unable to estimate the local fiscal effect of this bill. The local fiscal effect would be determined by the specific ordinances, if any, that would be voided by this bill. For example, were a local ordinance regulating county jail employee hours or overtime voided by the bill, the uniform state law that would take its place may result in increased or decreased costs for the county, depending on how state law differs from the voided ordinance. DOC does not have a feasible method of determining all the local ordinances that would be voided by this bill and the fiscal impact in each case.
