Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill would ratify the Physical Therapy Licensure Compact. The compact would allow a licensed physical therapist that resides in one compact state to practice in another compact state.

The bill would require the department to promulgate administrative rules. The department estimates rule making would require approximately 120 of staff time.

The State of Wisconsin is currently a signatory of the Nurse Licensure Compact. The department utilizes the Nurse License Verification IT system, known as NURSYS, to license and regulate nurses through the compact. Based on the department's experience with NURSYS, the department estimates that it would require 204 hours of staff time to redesign IT systems in order to license and regulate physical therapists through the Physical Therapy Licensure Compact. The department would incur IT costs related to: 1) changes to the Integrated Credentialing and Enforcement (ICE) database system to recognize compact licensed physical therapists; 2) preparing and transferring ICE data on Wisconsin licensees to the Physical Therapy Licensure Compact; 3) redesign the online license lookup system to recognize compact licensed physical therapists; 4) redesign the workflow for license renewals to recognize compact licensed physical therapists; and, 5) test all system changes.

The department would also incur costs related to: 1) creating new forms and updating existing forms; 2) updating standard operating procedures for credential processing staff; 3) training credential processing staff on the new forms and procedures; and, 4) updating the department's website. These items would take approximately 204 hours of staff time.

As currently written, the bill's effective date is the day after publication. The department would be able to absorb the one-time costs if the effective date were delayed into fiscal year 2018-19.

The bill would require approximately 120 of staff time for rule making at a cost of \$4,700. The bill would require approximately 204 hours for IT upgrades at a cost of \$17,500. The bill would also require 204 hours for tasks related to updating forms and training staff at a cost of \$5,900. Total one-time costs are estimated at \$28,100. The department cannot absorb these costs within existing budgets. As currently written, the bill's effective date is the day after publication. The department would be able to absorb the one-time costs if the effective date were delayed into fiscal year 2018-19.
