**2017 ASSEMBLY BILL 600**

Assembly Bill 600 would permit the Town of Cable to create a tax incremental district (TID) in the same manner as a city or village.

**ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1**

Generally, under current TID law, a city or village must satisfy the “12%” test when creating or amending a TID. The 12% test limits the value increments of existing TIDs and the value of a proposed TID to 12% of the municipality’s total equalized value. Under Assembly Amendment 1, the Town of Cable would be subject to a 5% limit instead of the 12% limit.

**ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 2**

Assembly Amendment 2 specifies that the Town of Cable may create only one TID while acting under the TID creation authority provided by the bill.

**BILL HISTORY**

2017 Assembly Bill 600 was introduced by Representative Quinn on October 27, 2017. On December 13, 2017, Representative Quinn offered Assembly Amendments 1 and 2. On December 14, 2017, the Assembly Committee on Ways and Means recommended adoption of Assembly Amendments 1 and 2 on votes of Ayes, 9; Noes, 2, and recommended passage of the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 11; Noes, 0.
