2017 SENATE BILL 366

2017 Senate Bill 366 authorizes a person who holds a Class “B” fermented malt beverages (“beer”) or “Class B” intoxicating liquor (wine and distilled spirits, hereinafter, “liquor”) license or permit to also sell beer or liquor, respectively, at specific locations within the Ozaukee County fairgrounds during special events held at the fairgrounds, if both of the following criteria apply:

- The licensee’s or permittee’s premises are located in Ozaukee County.
- The Ozaukee County Board adopts a resolution approving the licensee or permittee.

SENATE AMENDMENT 1

Senate Amendment 1 specifies that beer and liquor sold at specific locations within the Ozaukee County fairgrounds pursuant to the bill must be sold for consumption at the specific locations within the fairgrounds.

BILL HISTORY

Senator Stroebel introduced Senate Amendment 1 on September 14, 2017. On September 28, 2017, the Senate Committee on Government Operations, Technology and Consumer Protection voted to recommend the adoption of the amendment and the passage of the bill, as amended, on votes of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0.
