# 2017 ASSEMBLY BILL 1007

March 9, 2018 – Introduced by Representatives GENRICH, KOLSTE, OHNSTAD, SINICKI, BERCEAU, SUBECK, SARGENT and VRUWINK, cosponsored by Senators HANSEN and LARSON. Referred to Committee on Transportation.

1 AN ACT to amend 346.23 (1), 346.23 (2), 346.24 (1), 346.24 (2), 346.37 (1) (a) 1.,

2 346.37 (1) (c) 3., 346.37 (1) (c) 4., 346.37 (1) (d) 1. and 346.37 (1) (e) 1. of the

3 statutes; **relating to:** requiring vehicles to stop for pedestrians at certain

4 intersections and crosswalks.

#### Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires a vehicle operator to stop his or her vehicle and remain stopped until a pedestrian crossing at a crosswalk has completed crossing the roadway.

Under current law, the operator of a vehicle is required to yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian, personal delivery device, bicyclist, or rider of a personal assistive mobility device that is crossing a highway at an intersection or crosswalk controlled by a traffic signal on a green or "walk" signal or that is crossing a highway at an intersection or crosswalk not controlled by a traffic signal within a marked or unmarked crosswalk. "Yield the right-of-way to a pedestrian" is defined to mean that the operator of a vehicle must reduce speed, or stop if necessary, to avoid endangering, colliding with, or interfering with pedestrian travel.

This bill requires that, under these circumstances, rather than yield, the vehicle operator must stop the vehicle and remain stopped until the pedestrian,

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personal delivery device, bicyclist, or rider of a personal assistive mobility device has completed crossing the roadway.

# The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

1 SECTION 1. 346.23 (1) of the statutes, as affected by 2017 Wisconsin Act 13, is 2 amended to read:

3 346.23 (1) At an intersection or crosswalk where traffic is controlled by traffic control signals or by a traffic officer, the operator of a vehicle shall yield the 4  $\mathbf{5}$ right-of-way to stop the vehicle when a pedestrian or personal delivery device, or to 6 a person who is riding a bicycle or electric personal assistive mobility device in a 7 manner which that is consistent with the safe use of the crosswalk by pedestrians, 8 that has started to cross the highway on a green signal or a pedestrian signal 9 authorizing crossing and in and shall remain stopped until the pedestrian, personal 10 delivery device, bicyclist, or rider of an electric personal assistive mobility device has 11 completed crossing the roadway. In all other cases, pedestrians, bicyclists, and riders 12of electric personal assistive mobility devices shall yield, and personal delivery 13device operators shall ensure that personal delivery devices yield, the right-of-way 14to vehicles lawfully proceeding directly ahead on a green signal. No The operator of a vehicle proceeding ahead on a green signal may begin a and preparing to turn at 1516 a controlled intersection or crosswalk when where a pedestrian, personal delivery 17device, bicyclist, or rider of an electric personal assistive mobility device is crossing 18 in the crosswalk on a green signal or a pedestrian signal authorizing crossing would 19 be endangered or interfered with in any way shall stop the vehicle and shall remain 20stopped until the pedestrian, personal delivery device, bicyclist, or rider of an electric 21personal assistive mobility device has complete crossing the roadway. (2). 4 **SECTION 2.** 346.23 (2) of the statutes, as affected by 2017 Wisconsin Act 13, is  $\mathbf{5}$ amended to read: 6 346.23 (2) At intersections or crosswalks on divided highways or highways 7 provided with safety zones where traffic is controlled by traffic control signals or by 8 a traffic officer, the operator of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to stop the 9 <u>vehicle when</u> a pedestrian, personal delivery device, bicyclist, or rider of an electric 10 personal assistive mobility device that has started to cross the roadway either from 11 the near curb or shoulder or from the center dividing strip or a safety zone with the 12green signal or a pedestrian signal authorizing crossing in the favor of the pedestrian, personal delivery device, bicyclist, or rider of an electric personal 1314 assistive mobility device and shall remain stopped until the pedestrian, personal 15delivery device, bicyclist, or rider of an electric personal assistive mobility device has 16 completed crossing the roadway. 17**SECTION 3.** 346.24 (1) of the statutes, as affected by 2017 Wisconsin Act 13, is

19 346.24 (1) At an intersection or crosswalk where traffic is not controlled by 20 traffic control signals or by a traffic officer, the operator of a vehicle shall yield the 21 right-of-way to stop the vehicle when a pedestrian or personal delivery device, or to 22 a person riding a bicycle or electric personal assistive mobility device in a manner 23 which that is consistent with the safe use of the crosswalk by pedestrians, that is 24 crossing the highway within a marked or unmarked crosswalk and shall remain 2017 – 2018 Legislature

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1	stopped until the pedestrian, personal delivery device, bicyclist, or rider of an electric
2	personal assistive mobility device has completed crossing the roadway.
3	SECTION 4. 346.24 (2) of the statutes, as affected by 2017 Wisconsin Act 13, is
4	amended to read:
5	346.24 (2) No pedestrian, personal delivery device, bicyclist, or rider of an
6	electric personal assistive mobility device may suddenly leave, and no personal
7	delivery device operator may allow a personal delivery device to suddenly leave, a
8	curb or other place of safety and walk, run, or ride into the path of a vehicle which
9	is so close that it is difficult for the operator of the vehicle to <del>yield</del> <u>stop</u> .
10	<b>SECTION 5.</b> 346.37 (1) (a) 1. of the statutes is amended to read:
11	346.37 (1) (a) 1. Vehicular traffic facing a green signal may proceed straight
12	through, make a U-turn, or turn right or left unless a sign at such place prohibits
13	the turning maneuver, but, subject to s. 346.23, vehicular traffic shall yield the
14	right-of-way to other vehicles and to pedestrians lawfully within the intersection or
15	an adjacent crosswalk at the time the signal is exhibited.
16	<b>SECTION 6.</b> $346.37(1)(c)$ 3. of the statutes, as affected by 2017 Wisconsin Act
17	13, is amended to read:
18	346.37(1)(c) 3. Vehicular traffic facing a red signal at an intersection may, after
19	stopping as required under subd. 1., cautiously enter the intersection to make a right
20	turn into the nearest lawfully available lane for traffic moving to the right or to turn
21	left from a one-way highway into the nearest lawfully available lane of a one-way
22	highway on which vehicular traffic travels to the left. Vehicular traffic in the leftmost
23	right-turn lane of a roadway that provides 2 right-turn lanes may make a right turn
24	on a red signal into a lawfully available lane that is 2nd to the rightmost lane for
25	traffic moving to the right. Except for a vehicle turning right from the leftmost

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1	right-turn lane of a roadway that provides 2 right-turn lanes, no turn may be made
2	on a red signal if lanes of moving traffic are crossed. No turn may be made on a red
3	signal if a sign at the intersection prohibits the turn on a red signal. In <u>Subject to</u>
4	s. 346.23, in making a turn on a red signal, vehicular traffic shall yield the
5	right-of-way to pedestrians, personal delivery devices, bicyclists, and riders of
6	electric personal assistive mobility devices lawfully within a crosswalk, to operators
7	of vehicles making a lawful U-turn, and to other traffic lawfully using the
8	intersection.
9	<b>SECTION 7.</b> 346.37 (1) (c) 4. of the statutes, as affected by 2017 Wisconsin Act
10	13, is amended to read:
11	346.37 (1) (c) 4. Notwithstanding subd. 1., a motorcycle, moped, motor bicycle,
12	or bicycle facing a red signal at an intersection may, after stopping as required under
13	subd. 1. for not less than 45 seconds, proceed cautiously through the intersection
14	before the signal turns green if no other vehicles are present at the intersection to
15	actuate the signal and the operator of the motorcycle, moped, motor bicycle, or bicycle
16	reasonably believes the signal is vehicle actuated. The <u>Subject to s. 346.23, the</u>
17	operator of a motorcycle, moped, motor bicycle, or bicycle proceeding through a red
18	signal under this subdivision shall yield the right-of-way to any vehicular traffic,
19	pedestrian, personal delivery device, bicyclist, or rider of an electric personal
20	assistive mobility device proceeding through a green signal at the intersection or
21	lawfully within a crosswalk or using the intersection. This subdivision does not
22	affect any authorization for a bicyclist under subd. 2.

23 SECTION 8. 346.37 (1) (d) 1. of the statutes, as affected by 2017 Wisconsin Act
24 13, is amended to read:

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1	346.37 (1) (d) 1. Vehicular traffic facing a green arrow signal may enter the
2	intersection to make the movement indicated by the arrow but, subject to s. 346.23,
3	shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians, personal delivery devices, bicyclists, and
4	riders of electric personal assistive mobility devices lawfully within a crosswalk and
5	to other traffic lawfully using the intersection. Vehicular traffic facing a left turn
6	arrow may make a U-turn unless a sign prohibits U-turns. When the green arrow
7	signal indicates a right or left turn, traffic shall cautiously enter the intersection.
8	<b>SECTION 9.</b> 346.37 (1) (e) 1. of the statutes, as affected by 2017 Wisconsin Act
9	13, is amended to read:
10	346.37 (1) (e) 1. Vehicular traffic facing a flashing yellow arrow signal may
11	cautiously enter the intersection to make the movement indicated by the arrow but,
12	subject to s. 346.23, shall yield the right-of-way to pedestrians, personal delivery
13	devices, bicyclists, and riders of electric personal assistive mobility devices lawfully
14	within a crosswalk and to other traffic lawfully using the intersection. Vehicular
15	traffic facing a left turn arrow may make a U-turn unless a sign prohibits U-turns.
16	SECTION 10. Initial applicability.
17	(1) This act first applies to offenses committed on the effective date of this
18	subsection but does not preclude the counting of other convictions as prior
19	convictions for purposes of sentencing by a court, administrative action by the
20	department of transportation, or suspension or revocation of motor vehicle operating
21	privileges.
