November 10, 2017 - Introduced by Representatives SKOWRONSKI, BROSTOFF, ROHRKASTE, MEYERS, TITTL, KOLSTE, ANDERSON, R. BROOKS, MACCO, MURSAU, PRONSCHINSKE, BERCEAU, SUBECK, SINICKI, NOVAK, HESSELBEIN, KULP, KITCHENS and SPIROS, cosponsored by Senators STROEBEL, JOHNSON and L. TAYLOR. Referred to Committee on Mental Health.

1 **AN ACT** *to renumber and amend* 175.51 (1m) (b); and *to create* 175.51 (1m) (b)
2 1. and 2. and 343.252 of the statutes; **relating to:** referrals for subjects of alerts
3 for missing adults and operator's license review.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires a law enforcement agency that has issued an alert for a missing adult at risk, commonly known as a "Silver Alert," to refer the person making the report and any guardian of the missing person to a local aging and disability resource center. If the subject of such an alert was driving a vehicle when he or she was reported missing, this bill also requires the law enforcement agency to notify the Department of Transportation. If DOT receives such a notification, DOT must review the driver's license of the person to determine if restrictions should be imposed on the person's license for the safety of the person or the public.
