Senate Bill 583. Relating to: regulation of all-terrain vehicles and utility terrain vehicles, all-terrain vehicle projects, and making an appropriation. By Senators Marklein, Bernier and LeMahieu; cosponsored by Representatives Felzkowski, Swearingen, Edming, Katsma, Krug, Kulp, Kurtz, Milroy, Novak, Quinn, Snyder, Summerfield, Tranel, Tusler, Vorpapel and Wichgers. **(Report approved by the Governor with partial veto on 3-3-2020. 2019 Wisconsin Act 183)**

QUESTION: **Shall the bill pass notwithstanding the objections of the Governor?**

Senate Bill 43. Relating to: paddlewheel raffles. (FE) By Senators Jacque, Marklein, Nass, Olsen and Wanggaard; cosponsored by Representatives Murphy, Mursau, Brooks, Edming, Gundrum, Horlacher, Pronschinske, Quinn, Ramthun, Skowronski, Sortwell, Tranel, Tusler, Wichgers, Zimmerman and Plumer. **(Report vetoed by the Governor on 3-3-2020)**

Senate Bill 60. Relating to: applicability of 2017 Wisconsin Act 184; time frame for reports for sexually violent persons petitioning for supervised release; and placement of sexually violent persons on supervised release. By Senators Feyen, Testin, Cowles and Marklein; cosponsored by Representatives Schraa, Krug, Brooks, Edming, Kitchens, Kuglitsch, Kulp, Murphy, Mursau, Spiros, Thiesfeldt, Tusler, Wichgers and Zimmerman. **(Report vetoed by the Governor on 11-22-2019)**

Senate Bill 292. Relating to: notices of eligibility to receive a prize. By Senators LeMahieu, Hansen, Marklein, Nass and Wirch; cosponsored by Representatives Tittl, Vorpapel, Katsma, Skowronski and Steffen. **(Report vetoed by the Governor on 3-3-2020)**

Senate Bill 613. Relating to: repossession of collateral or leased goods. By Senators Wanggaard, Bernier, Olsen and Stroebel; cosponsored by Representatives Kulp, Spiros, Tusler, Stuck and Skowronski. **(Report vetoed by the Governor on 2-28-2020)**

Senate Bill 821. Relating to: a property tax exemption for all machinery, tools, and patterns; a reduction of state general obligation and variable rate debt supported by general purpose revenue; and increasing the maximum deduction under the individual income tax sliding scale standard deduction. (FE) By Senators Fitzgerald, Roth and Darling; cosponsored by Representatives Vos, Steineke and Nygren. **(Report vetoed by the Governor on 2-26-2020)**
