Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill includes all of the following changes to housing and homelessness assistance programs administered by the Department of Administration.

1. Provides an additional \$900,000 in each fiscal year of the 2019-21 fiscal biennium for grants to provide housing and associated supportive services to homeless individuals and families.
2. Provides an additional \$500,000 in each fiscal year of the 2019-21 fiscal biennium for grants or loans to persons or families of low or moderate income to defray housing costs.
3. Provides an additional \$500,000 in each fiscal year of the 2019-21 fiscal biennium for grants to supplement the operating budgets of homeless shelters. The bill also includes additional criteria DOA must consider in awarding the homeless shelter grants and amends administrative rules of DOA concerning the grants so that DOA's rules are consistent with certain statutory requirements.
4. Provides \$300,000 for grants or loans to persons or families of low or moderate income for diversion programming. The bill defines "diversion programming" as short-term intervention that supports persons or families of low or moderate income in identifying immediate, safe housing arrangements, including by utilizing conflict resolution and mediation skills to reconnect the individuals or families to their support systems.

Can the Steineke office get the bills in the homelessness package broken up into smaller bills in the following ways?
Looking for this as quickly as you can.

LRB-1227/P3

- 1) All the diversion pieces, including \$300k increase, and the \$500k increase to HPP
- 2) All of the SSSG changes, including \$500k increase
- 3) The \$900k increase to HAP

LRB-1316/P4 – keep as is

LRB-1331/P3

- 1) The housing navigator grant as one section
- 2) The housing quality standards loan as another section

LRB-1332/P2

- 1) All the workforce changes as one section
- 2) The \$250k to skills enhancement as another section

I also have a question on this – I got feedback that on p.3, line 3 the phrase “the council on workforce investment shall identify all of the following...” could be interpreted by the department that they just have to identify these populations exist but there’s no requirement that they create a plan for dealing with their employment needs. Does that need to be tightened up, or is that too nit-picky?

I think I see the light at the end of the tunnel here. I heard back about the performance metrics for SSSG. Could we change LRB-1227/P4 in this way?

On page 2, line 12, change the line to read: "to obtain employment, increase their income, or increase their hours worked."

Add below that:

6. The eligible applicant's utilization rates for each unit
7. The percentage of population served by the eligible applicant that is chronically homeless
8. The average length of stay for clients of the eligible applicant

And then also add a qualification in that section that, when awarding the grants, the department is able to assess whether any eligible applicant's own rules may affect any of the performance metrics, and can reserve the right to adjust the grant award accordingly.
