Good morning, Krista and Fern.

Rep. Ballweg would like to have an additional grant program bill drafted for the Suicide Prevention Task Force.

Specifically, she would like to provide \$250,000 GPR per year in a new appropriation to DPI for distribution to public high schools to support peer-to-peer suicide prevention programs (for example, Hope Squad or Sources of Strength – these programs do not need to be identified in the draft). A public high school may apply for \$500 per year in support of an eligible program, for up to three years (so \$1,500, total). This funding may be used in support of existing programs, or may be used to establish a new program. The funding is sum certain and not to be prorated if it runs out.

We are currently working on identifying how much funding will be made available for the other bill drafts so that they can be updated accordingly. I will keep you posted.

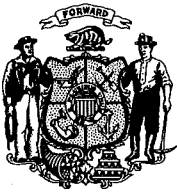

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***Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau***

This bill requires the Department of Public Instruction to award grants to school boards and operators of independent charter schools for the purpose of supporting peer-to-peer suicide prevention programs in high schools. The bill specifies that a grant may be used to support an existing program or to implement new program at a high school. Under the bill, the amount of a grant is \$500 for each high school at which an applicant indicates the grant will be used to support a peer-to-peer suicide prevention program. The bill specifies that DPI may not award a grant for a specific high school for more than three years. The bill also specifies that the grant amount may not be prorated in the event that an insufficient amount of money is appropriated in a fiscal year to provide the full grant amount to all applicants. Instead, the bill requires DPI to establish, by rule, criteria for awarding grants if insufficient moneys are appropriated in a fiscal year.

13 118.46, 118.50, 118.51, 118.52, 118.53, 118.55, 118.56, 120.12 (2m), (4m), (5), and (15)  
14 to (27), 120.125, 120.13 (1), (2) (b) to (g), (3), (14), (17) to (19), (26), (34), (35), (37),  
15 (37m), and (38), 120.137, 120.14, 120.20, 120.21 (3), and 120.25 are applicable to a  
16 1st class city school district and board but not, unless explicitly provided in this  
17 chapter or in the terms of a contract, to the commissioner or to any school transferred  
18 to an opportunity schools and partnership program.

19 **SECTION 6. Effective dates.** This act takes effect on the day after publication,  
20 except as follows:

21 (1) PAYMENT INDEXING MECHANISM FOR CHOICE SCHOOLS, INDEPENDENT CHARTER  
22 SCHOOLS, AND THE OPEN ENROLLMENT PROGRAM. The treatment of s. 118.40 (2r) (e) 2p.  
23 a. takes effect on July 1, 2020.
