Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill authorizes the Department of Public Instruction to award grants to school districts for teachers, pupil service professionals, principals, and school district administrators to participate in professional development trainings in character education. Under the bill, DPI is authorized to make these grants for 24 months.

Local: Indeterminate (Potential for increased revenues)

State: This bill creates a new annual appropriation providing \$100,000 GPR in FY20 and FY21 for the purpose of awarding grants to school districts for professional development training in character education. The Department is authorized to make these grants for 24 months.

The Department is likely to incur some additional costs to develop application and award processes. The bill does not provide additional funding for those administrative costs.
