**Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) and local health departments will have to adjust inspection methodology and documentation to account for the requirement added by the proposed legislation. With DATCP and local health departments generally sharing a common electronic information management platform any changes in the inspection report form could be made efficiently. Training related to the new requirement will be necessary but can be incorporated into the existing training program.

**Long-Range Fiscal Implications**

Once the inspection report form is changed to account for the new requirement, there would be negligible long-range fiscal implications.
