Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

If passed as currently drafted, 2019 Senate Bill 388 would increase the number of individuals who are subject to the Code of Ethics and the number of individuals that are required to file an annual statement of economic interests (SEI) with the Ethics Commission. As drafted, the bill includes any employee of a UW institution who is: (1) a chancellor, dean, director, (2) anyone who is responsible for signing a contract on behalf of the institution, or (3) an officer or board member of a UW-affiliated organization on an ongoing basis. According to the UW System website, there are 13 four-year universities and 13 two-year branch campuses within the system. It is not known how many individuals within each UW System school would be a chancellor, dean, director, or would be responsible for signing a contract. The number of "university affiliated organizations" is also not presently known; nor is it known how many individuals would be an officer or board member of the affiliated organizations. In light of the foregoing, it is unclear how many additional individuals would be subject to the Code of Ethics and required to file an SEI. Therefore, the Commission cannot calculate an exact amount of the increase in costs to the Commission.

The Commission will likely need to provide training to the newly-covered individuals concerning the ethics laws and lobbying laws. The Commission expects to be able to absorb these costs into its existing budget. Additionally, there will likely be an increased number of requests for advice. There may also be a few additional ethics complaints filed with the Commission. The amount of staff time required to provide advice and process complaints varies depending on the nature of the request or the nature of the complaint. While the number of requests for advice might be modest to significant, the number of additional complaints is anticipated to be minimal.

Currently, there are about 2,500 officials who are required to file an SEI with the Commission. Additionally, candidates are required to file an SEI as a part of obtaining ballot placement. The number of candidates filing an SEI varies. The Commission's website allows a person required to file to do so electronically. Any new officials would also use the site to file their SEI. Commission staff would have to add the new filers to the SEI system and provide training on how to use the system. There may also be additional public records requests made for SEI filings as a result of the bill.

Fiscal Estimate

The Commission expects an increase in the amount of staff time related to advice, complaints, and SEI-related efforts. It may be possible for the Commission to absorb the associated costs into the existing budget, but that is not certain because the Commission does not know how many additional individuals would become state public officials and would be required to file a SEI.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

Unknown.
