Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires each University of Wisconsin System school and each technical college to ensure the safety and continued access to education of student victims of sexual violence and harassment by providing these student victims with reasonable accommodations, including, to the extent they are reasonably available, housing and academic accommodations and campus escorts.

Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The fiscal effect of this bill is indeterminate due to the unknown accommodations that may be requested in each circumstance and the length of time each accommodation is needed.

UW System schools may incur costs related to transportation services, on campus or private housing accommodations, additional staff to provide police escorts, and mental health resources on campus or in the private sector.
