The Honorable, the Senate:

Pursuant to Senate Rule 44m (3), the Senate President may direct the chief clerk to present correctly enrolled legislation that originated in the Senate to the Governor. Please deliver the following bills to the Governor's office immediately.

- **Senate Bill 60**, relating to applicability of 2017 Wisconsin Act 184; time frame for reports for sexually violent persons, petitioning for supervised release; and placement of sexually violent persons on supervised release
- **Senate Bill 74**, relating to the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact
- **Senate Bill 86**, relating to registration and operation of vehicles defined as autocycles
- **Senate Bill 106**, relating to micro market licensing fees
- **Senate Bill 142**, relating to late payments of tuition benefits for student veterans enrolled in the University of Wisconsin System or a technical college
- **Senate Bill 155**, relating to participation in the Volunteer Health Care Provider program by agencies serving homeless individuals
- **Senate Bill 166**, relating to eligibility for physician, dentist, and health care provider educational loan assistance programs
- **Senate Bill 169**, relating to wetland mitigation banks, providing an exemption from emergency rule procedures, providing an exemption from rule-making procedures, and requiring the exercise of rule-making authority
- **Senate Bill 170**, relating to allowing minors to operate temporary stands without a permit or license
- **Senate Bill 188**, relating to regulating hemp, providing an exemption from emergency rule procedures, granting rule-making authority, and making an appropriation
- **Senate Bill 208**, relating to allocation of early state seed investment credit to offset taxes imposed on insurers
- **Senate Bill 219**, relating to agricultural development loan guarantee program administered by the Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development Authority
- **Senate Bill 269**, relating to tax increment value reporting errors and property tax reimbursement
- **Senate Bill 290**, relating to pepper spray and CS gel substances
- **Senate Bill 304**, relating to prohibited practices of motor vehicle manufacturers, importers, and distributors and providing a penalty
- **Senate Bill 319**, relating to the transportation facilities economic assistance and development program
- **Senate Bill 320**, relating to evidence of ownership for purpose of obtaining certain motor vehicle certificates of title
- **Senate Bill 349**, relating to requirements for devices that dispense gasoline-ethanol fuel blends
- **Senate Bill 362**, relating to repealing obsolete refundable tax credits
- **Senate Bill 380**, relating to coverage of services under Medical Assistance provided through telehealth and other technologies, extending the time limit for emergency rule procedures, and granting rule-making authority
- **Senate Bill 447**, relating to supplemental transportation aids
- **Senate Bill 457**, relating to P.O.D. accounts and loan obligations to financial institutions; the duty of a bank to make payment on a lost, destroyed, or stolen cashier's check, teller's check, or certified check; providing temporary authority to act as a mortgage loan originator while a license application is pending; property

subject to garnishment or tax levy in possession of a financial institution; entities that provide to financial institutions electronic data processing services; loans to state banks by a Federal Home Loan Bank; and consolidating the Banking Review Board and Savings Institutions Review Board in the Department of Financial Institutions
