2019 ASSEMBLY BILL 168

The bill creates an exception to the current requirement that a voter state his or her name and address prior to receiving an election ballot. Under the bill, a voter is not required to state his or her name and address if the voter is unable to do so **because of a disability**.

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1

The amendment deletes the reference to a disability in the exception created by the bill. Thus, under the amendment, a voter is not required to state his or her name and address if the voter is unable to do so.

BILL HISTORY

Assembly Amendment 1 was offered by Representative Zimmerman on May 24, 2019. On May 29, 2019, the Assembly Committee on Campaigns and Elections recommended adoption of the amendment and passage of the bill, as amended, on votes of Ayes, 7; Noes, 0.
