2019 Assembly Bill 353

Assembly Amendment 1

2019 Assembly Bill 353 modifies inspection requirements for recreational and educational camps, which are licensed by the Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection (DATCP) or a local health department acting as DATCP's agent. Recreational and educational camp licenses must be renewed annually, and the camps are currently subject to annual inspections by DATCP or the local health department.

2019 ASSEMBLY BILL 353

The bill requires DATCP or the local health department to waive, for two out of every three license years, any inspection that is required for license renewal as a recreational or educational camp, if the camp has received accreditation from the American Camp Association for those years.

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1

The amendment replaces the language of the bill and instead states that DATCP or the local health department may waive, for not more than two out of every three license years, any routine inspection for those license years if the camp has exhibited effective managerial control of public health hazards, as defined by DATCP by rule.

BILL HISTORY

Representative James offered Assembly Amendment 1 on October 10, 2019. On February 13, 2020, the Assembly Committee on Regulatory Licensing Reform unanimously recommended adoption of the amendment and passage of the bill, as amended.
