Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires school boards to provide age-appropriate instruction to pupils, at least once in grades six to eight and at least once in grades 9 to 12, in the prevention of teen dating violence and sexual violence and establishes certain criteria governing the instruction provided. The bill requires the Department of Public Instruction to prepare, by January 1, 2023, a policy governing the prevention of and appropriate responses to teen dating violence and sexual violence when pupils are at school and while pupils are under the supervision of a school authority.

The bill also requires DPI to incorporate a teen dating violence and sexual violence prevention curriculum into DPI's model health problems education curriculum. Each school board must adopt either DPI's policy and curriculum or the school board's own policy and curriculum by July 1, 2023.

Finally, the bill requires DPI to provide training to all school district employees who have direct contact with pupils in grades 6 to 12 in the prevention of and appropriate responses to teen dating violence and sexual violence when pupils are at school and while pupils are under the supervision of a school authority. A school district employee must attend such training within the first six months after beginning employment with the school district and at least once every five years after the initial training.

Local Fiscal Impact: Indeterminate

Schools that choose to create their own policy and curriculum, rather than adopting the Department's model policy and curriculum, will likely incur some additional costs; those costs will vary among schools. It is unknown how many schools would adopt the department's model policy and curriculum or choose to adopt their own. Therefore, the local fiscal impact is indeterminate.

State Fiscal Impact: None

The Department would need to commit staff resources to develop a model policy and model curriculum on teen dating violence and sexual violence curriculum. The bill does not provide additional position or budget authority to implement the new requirements under the bill, so the bill would not have a direct impact on the state's general fund. The Department would have to absorb the work within existing staff resources.
