

EXECUTIVE ORDER #118

Relating to State Agency Drug-Free Workplace Certification
to the U.S. Department of Labor

WHEREAS, the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1988 P.L. 100-690 (the "Act") requires all federal governmental agency grantees and contractors to certify that they will provide a drug-free workplace as a precondition of receiving a contract or grant from a federal agency; and

WHEREAS, the State of Wisconsin through its many agencies and departments contracts with or receives grant funds from various federal governmental agencies to the benefit of this state and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, revised federal regulations under the Act provide that the state may make one blanket certification for all state agencies, or, in the alternative, each state agency may independently make the certification; and

WHEREAS, it is more effective and efficient to have each state agency, as needed, regulate and monitor the measures taken to ensure a drug-free workplace; and

WHEREAS, I am firmly resolved and strongly committed to the promotion of effective measures in America's War on Drugs, particularly as they affect all of the citizens of this great state;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, TOMMY G. THOMPSON, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the laws of this State, and specifically by Wisconsin Statute section 14.019, do hereby:

1. Direct all state agencies and departments which contract with or receive grants from any federal agency to independently submit an annual drug-free workplace certification to any federal governmental agency with which it contracts or from which it receives grant funds.
2. Direct the Department of Administration to assist the implementation of this Executive Order by making available its staff and resources to assist state agencies and departments with the certification process, as needed.


3. Direct the Department of Administration to coordinate the certification efforts of the various state agencies to ensure compliance with the federal guidelines and regulations.
