EXECUTIVE ORDER # 104

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Chief Warrant Officer 2 Joshua Scott of the United States Army Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom

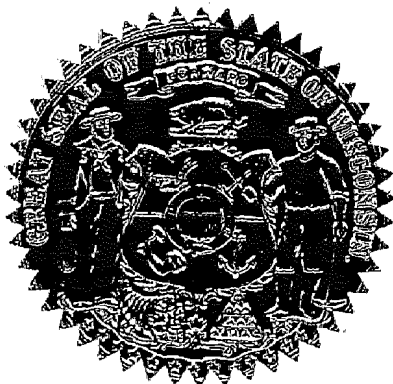
WHEREAS, on May 26, 2005, Chief Warrant Officer 2 Joshua Scott, a member of 1st Squadron, 17th Cavalry Regiment, 82nd Airborne Division, United States Army, died as a result of injuries sustained during enemy action in Iraq; and

WHEREAS, Chief Warrant Officer 2 Joshua Scott provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and


WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Chief Warrant Officer 2 Joshua Scott; and

WHEREAS, a memorial service will be held for Chief Warrant Officer 2 Joshua Scott on Saturday, June 4, 2005;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on **June 4, 2005**, and ending at sunset on that date.
