EXECUTIVE ORDER # 107

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Lance Corporal John Mattek Jr. of the United States Marine Corps Who Lost His Life During Operation Iraqi Freedom

WHEREAS, on June 13, 2005, Lance Corporal John Mattek Jr., a member of 2nd Light Armored Reconnaissance Battalion, Regimental Combat Team-2, 2nd Marine Division, II Marine Expeditionary Force, United States Marine Corps, died as a result of wounds received during enemy action in Iraq; and

WHEREAS, Lance Corporal John Mattek Jr. provided faithful and honorable service to the people of the State of Wisconsin and the people of the United States; and


WHEREAS, the people of Wisconsin mourn the death of Lance Corporal John Mattek Jr.; and

WHEREAS, Lance Corporal John Mattek Jr. will be laid to rest on Monday, June 20, 2005;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, JIM DOYLE, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by Federal and State law, do hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds and military installations of the State of Wisconsin equipped with such flags beginning at sunrise on **June 20, 2005**, and ending at sunset on that date.
