Oral Exhibit No. 1	John Mielke Associated Builders and Contractors of Wisconsin, Madison	<ul> <li>Is opposed to the removal of qualification requirements to take the commercial electrical inspector exam, Comm 5.62 (3).</li> <li>Believes the qualifications should be retained for the following reasons: <ul> <li>The qualifications are similar to those for the master electrician and if appropriate for the electrician why not for the inspector.</li> <li>Field experience is invaluable in determine proper installation or recognizing alternative compliance methods.</li> <li>Field experience provides an understanding to "visualize" appropriate alternatives when making code interpretations.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Believes the qualifications make for better inspectors.</li> </ul>		The proposed removal of the qualifications to take the commercial electrical inspector exam makes the rules consistent with those for taking the commercial building inspector exam and the commercial plumbing inspector exam. The inspector must pass an exam equivalent to that for a master electrician in order to be certified. The function of the inspector is to facilitate code compliance while statutorily, the electrician is primarily responsible for code compliance.

Concerned that credential holders acquire the proper continuing education during the credential term in order to keep up with products and codes affecting the sprinkler industry. Suggested that 12 hours of continuing education be required to be obtained in each of the 2-year period of the 4-year credential term.		The Department will monitor the affect of 4-year credential term and the associated continuing educational obligations in promoting safety in the construction of buildings. The Department has not seen a negative impact with respect to other types of credentials that were previously transitioned to 4-year terms.
