Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

- The Safety and Buildings Division is responsible for administering and enforcing rules relating to boilers and pressure vessels. The proposed rules adopt by reference the latest edition of ASME Standards and clarify existing technical requirements. The existing requirements relating to solid fuel-fired water-heating appliances have been reorganized and modified to permit an automatic feed system and the use of other fuels. The proposed rules for solid fuel-fired water-heating appliance may slightly increase the Division's workload, but it is anticipated the work can be absorbed within the agency's budget.
- The proposed rules will not have a fiscal effect on other state agencies or local governments.
- The proposed rules will require inspection of solid fuel-fired water-heating appliances but it is anticipated this inspection cost will not have a significant effect on the private sector.
