10. Types of Small Businesses Affected:

None of the hospitals in Wisconsin meet the definition of a small business as defined under s. 227.114 (1) (a), Wisconsin Stats., "small business" as a business entity, including its affiliates, which is independently owned and operated and not dominant in its field, and which employs 25 or fewer full-time employees or which has gross annual sales of less than \$5 million.

11. Fiscal Analysis Summary

Under this proposed order, the department establishes forfeiture dollar amounts for violations of s. 50.375 (2) and (3), Stats., relating to emergency contraception services to a female victim of sexual assault. The proposed forfeiture assessment ranges from \$2,500 for a first violation to \$5,000 for a subsequent violation. The Wisconsin constitution requires that all forfeitures are to be deposited in the Common School Fund with this department receiving no benefit from the forfeiture assessment. The State of Wisconsin operates 4 hospitals, 11 other hospitals are operated by counties or other local governmental entities and would be subject to forfeiture

assessment if they were found to be out of compliance. There may be an increase in costs for government run hospitals that violate s. 50.375, Stats. There are no other provisions in the proposed rules beyond statutory requirements that would affect state or local government costs.
