The Madison hearing commenced at 10:00 a.m... Three persons attended, but only two offered verbal comments. Both the Wausau and Milwaukee hearings had no attendees.

The public hearing record for written comments remained open until January 29, 2010. The department received one hundred eighty-four (184) written comments for the hearing record. The comments may be summarized as follows:
