Section 1. WHEREAS, in accordance with the power and authority delegated to the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by virtue of and pursuant to the provisions of sections 23.09 (7), 29.085 and 29.174 of the Wisconsin Statutes, the said State Conservation Commission, after due notice published once each week for three successive weeks on April 21, 28, and May 5, 1955, in the Wisconsin State Journal of Madison, Wisconsin, held public hearings on May 9, 1955, in seventy-one counties within the state at the county seats or other properly designated places, to secure recommendations concerning the open and closed seasons, bag limits, size limits, possession limits, and other regulations pertaining to the taking of fish, crayfish, and frogs in the inland and outlying waters of the state of Wisconsin, and

Section 2. WHEREAS, upon the evidence presented at the aforesaid public hearings, and upon evidence from other investigations duly made, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin verily believes that the supply of fish, crayfish, and frogs is sufficient within the inland and outlying waters of the state to warrant the opening of a season for the taking thereof under proper regulations.

Section 3. NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND DECLARED by the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin, by virtue of and pursuant to the provisions of sections 29.085 and 29.174 of the Wisconsin statutes, that State Conservation Commission Orders Nos. F-847, F-847 (Amended 1), F-847 (Amended 2) and F-847 (Amended 3) be and the same are hereby rescinded and that the open and closed seasons, bag limits, size limits, possession limits and other rules and regulations incorporated in this order for the taking, catching, and killing of all fish, crayfish, and frogs in the inland and outlying waters as listed herein shall take precedence over all previous orders and over all statutes which they modify, but no statutes or parts thereof which are not specifically modified are in any way affected. All seasons and other rules and regulations contained in this order shall remain in force and effect until such time as they are rescinded or modified either by legislative action or by State Conservation Commission order.

Section 4. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that there shall be and are provided and established the following open and closed seasons, bag limits, size limits, possession limits and other regulations for the several varieties and species of fish, crayfish, and frogs in the waters within the state of Wisconsin. A closed season is established for each variety of fish, crayfish, and frogs named herein extending during all the time of the year except the open season period embraced within the specified dates, both inclusive, and except as otherwise expressly provided no person shall take, catch or kill fish of any variety, or fish for fish by any means other than with hook and line, nor at any time other than the open season therefor, nor have in his possession or under his control any fish, crayfish, or frogs in excess of the daily bag or possession limit, or below the minimum size therefor during the open season as provided in this order.

Section 5. WATERS CLASSIFIED.

(1) Outlying waters. The following named waters are classified by Section 29.01 (4) as outlying waters:

Lakes Superior and Michigan, Green Bay, Sturgeon Bay, Sawyer's Harbor, and the Fox river from its mouth to the dam at DePere.

(a) For the purpose of regulating hook and line fishing in outlying waters, the closed seasons, size limits, bag and possession limits shall be the same as those prescribed for the inland waters of the county in which such outlying waters are located, except as otherwise specifically provided in the following table:

(b) There shall be no bag limit on catfish 16 inches or more in the outlying waters exclusive of bounded bays and reserve waters.

(c) Herring of any size with no bag limit may be taken by hook and line at all times in the outlying waters.

(d) All species of fish of lawful size may be taken from the outlying waters including Chequamegon bay by trolling from a motor-driven or sailboat during the open season therefor. It shall be unlawful to spear any species or variety of fish in the outlying and reserve waters at any time, except that carp may be speared from sunrise to sunset in all outlying waters, and lake trout and northern pike may be speared through the ice in Lake Superior.

(2) Interstate inland boundary waters. Fishing seasons and other fishing regulations on the interstate boundary waters between the states of Wisconsin and Minnesota and the states of Wisconsin and Iowa, namely the Mississippi river, Lake Pepin, the St. Croix river, Lake St. Croix, and the St. Louis river, where they form a common boundary between the said states and on interstate boundary waters between the states of Wisconsin and Michigan are not established under the provisions of this order.

(3) Inland waters. Fishing seasons and other fishing regulations on all other waters classified as inland waters including the Kakagon sloughs in Ashland county come under the provisions of this order.

Section 6. SEASON TABLES. Open and closed seasons, size and bag limits and measurements.

(1) The open seasons specified in the following table apply to fishing in open water and fishing through the ice. For open seasons in specified waters see Section 7 of this order. The possession limit for each species of fish shall be the same as the daily bag limit specified in this order. The measurement of all fish taken shall be in a straight line from the tip of the snout to the utmost end of the tail-fin fully extended.

(4) A closed season is established for the taking, catching, or killing of fish of any variety or fishing for fish from December 1 to the following April 29, both dates inclusive, on all waters commonly known as the Chippewa flowage and that part of the Chippewa river in the following described area, Sawyer county:

Section 7. OPEN SEASONS IN SPECIFIED WATERS.

(1) The open season for hook and line fishing for northern pike or pickerel and yellow walleye and sauger in the following described waters shall begin on April 1 each year. Bag limits, possession limits, and size limits shall be the same as prescribed in the season tables.

(a) Wolf river waters. The Wolf river waters shall include the following:

1. Lake Poygan in Winnebago and Waushara counties.
2. Lakes Winneconne and Big Butte des Morts in Winnebago county.
3. The Wolf river in Winnebago, Waupaca, and Outagamie counties and in Shawano county upstream to the dam in the city of Shawano.
4. The Willow river in Waushara county beginning at the dam at Auroraville downstream to Lake Poygan.
5. The Pine river in Waushara county beginning at the dam at Poysippi downstream to Lake Poygan.

- (b) Fox river waters. The Fox river waters shall include:
1. The Fox river in Marquette, Green Lake, Waushara, Winnebago, and Outagamie counties, and downstream to the dam at DePere in Brown county.
  2. Buffalo lake in Marquette county.
  3. Lake Puckaway in Green Lake county.
  4. Little Lake Butte des Morts in Winnebago county.
  5. Grand river from Fairwater downstream to its junction with the Fox river.
- (c) Lake Winnebago waters. Lake Winnebago waters shall include:
1. Lake Winnebago in Calumet, Fond du Lac, and Winnebago counties.
  2. Fond du Lac river within the city limits of Fond du Lac.
- (d) Little Fox river waters. The Little Fox river waters shall include the Fox river in Kenosha county.
- (e) Rock river waters. The Rock river waters shall include:
1. The Rock river in Dodge, Jefferson and Rock counties.
  2. The Crawfish river in Columbia, Dodge, and Jefferson counties.
  3. The Beaver Dam river beginning at the dam in the city of Beaver Dam in Dodge county downstream to the Crawfish river.
  4. The Scuppernong river beginning at the dam at Palmyra in Jefferson county downstream to the Bark river.
  5. The Bark river beginning at the dam at Hebron in Jefferson county and downstream to the Rock river.
  6. The Yahara (Catfish) river beginning at the dam at Fulton in Rock county downstream to the Rock river.
  7. Busseyville creek in Dane and Jefferson counties beginning at the Rockdale dam downstream to Lake Koshkonong.
- (f) Wisconsin river waters. The Wisconsin river waters shall include the Wisconsin river beginning at the Mosinee dam in Marathon county downstream to Chicago, Burlington and Quincy railroad bridge in Crawford and Grant counties, including all connecting sloughs and bayous, except that part of the Yellow river in the Castle Rock flowage in Juneau county upstream from the County Trunk Highway "G" bridge.
- (g) Lake Koshkonong waters. Lake Koshkonong waters shall include Lake Koshkonong in Dane, Jefferson, and Rock counties.
- (h) Lafayette county waters. The Lafayette county waters shall include the Pecatonica river and the Fever river in Lafayette county.
- (i) Manitowoc county waters. The Manitowoc county waters shall include the Branch river, the East and West Twin rivers, the Little Manitowoc river, the Manitowoc river, and the Sheboygan river in Manitowoc county.

(j) Sheboygan county waters. The Sheboygan county waters shall include the Black river, the Pigeon river, and the Sheboygan river in Sheboygan county.

(2) Duck creek, open season. There shall be an open season for the taking of all species of fish through the ice only from sunrise to sunset, by means of spears or dip nets, with no size limit or bag limit, in the waters of Duck creek, beginning at its mouth and extending upstream to the first dam above Pamperin Park, all in the town of Howard, Brown county, Wisconsin.

All fish taken from Duck creek under the provisions of this subsection shall be removed from the ice and no game fish so taken shall be sold, traded or bartered in any manner.

This season shall be effective from January 1 until the ice goes out of that area of Duck creek defined in this subsection.

(3) Special waters. (a) There shall be no closed season for hook and line fishing for any species of fish in the following described waters, all bag limits, minimum size limits and other regulations governing fish and fishing as set forth in the provisions of this order shall remain in full force and effect; Goose lake in Adams county; Petenwell flowage in Adams and Juneau counties; Lizzie Paul's lake in Buffalo county; Knickerbocker and Shattuck lakes in Chippewa county; Bass and Crystal lakes in Dane county; Lake Koshkonong in Dane, Jefferson and Rock counties; Beaver Dam, Emily, and Lost lakes and Lake Simmissippi in Dodge county; Dunnville Bottoms excluding the Red Cedar river in Dunn county; Price lake in Florence county; Mullet lake in Fond du Lac county; Rush lake in Fond du Lac and Winnebago counties; Heart and Maria lakes in Green Lake county; Bean, Hahn, Hope, Red Cedar and Mud Lake at Koshkonong in Jefferson county; Lily and Montgomery lakes in Kenosha county; Silver Birch lake in Pepin county; Little Horseshoe lake in Polk county; Bass and Pleasant lakes in Portage county; Gates, Perch, Riley and Sailor lakes in Price county; Bowers and Grass lakes in Rock county; No. 4 lake in Rusk county; Bushnell, Pine, Three, and Twin lakes in St. Croix county; Kolpack and White lakes in Shawano county; Sheboygan Marsh in Sheboygan county; Loraine, North, Pell, and Wandawega lakes in Walworth county; Big Muskego lake (except Bass Bay) in Waukesha county; Crystal, Kinney, Silver, and White lakes in Waupaca county.

(b) Dip netting is permitted through the ice only from 7:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. for any species of fish in the following described waters, all bag limits, size limits, and other regulations governing fish and fishing as set forth in this order shall remain in full force and effect: Goose lake in Adams county; Lizzie Paul's lake in Buffalo county; Knickerbocker and Shattuck lakes in Chippewa county; Bass and Crystal lakes in Dane county; Emily and Lost lakes in Dodge county; Dunnville Bottoms excluding the Red Cedar river in Dunn county; Price lake in Florence county; Mullet lake in Fond du Lac county; Rush lake in Fond du Lac and Winnebago counties; Heart and Maria lakes in Green Lake county; Lily and Montgomery lakes in Kenosha county; Silver Birch

lake in Pepin county; Little Horseshoe lake in Polk county; Bass and Pleasant lakes in Portage county; Gates, Perch, Riley, and Sailor lakes in Price county; Bowers and Grass lakes in Rock county; No. 4 lake in Rusk county; Bushnell, Pine, Three, and Twin lakes in St. Croix county; Kolpack and White lakes in Shawano county; Loraine, North, Pell, and Wandawega lakes in Walworth county; Big Muskego lake (except Bass Bay) in Waukesha county; Crystal, Kinney, Silver and White lakes in Waupaca county.

#### Section 8. CLOSED SEASON FOR CRAYFISH AND FROGS.

(1) Crayfish. There shall be a closed season on crayfish or crabs in Crawford, Grant, LaCrosse, and Vernon counties from March 1 to Saturday nearest May 1. In all other inland waters the closed season shall be from March 1 to June 15. During this period it is unlawful to take, capture, kill, or have in possession or under control any crayfish or crab taken from the inland waters.

(2) During the open season crayfish or crabs may be taken in the following ways:

By hand in all counties;

By minnow seines and minnow dip nets where the same are permitted for the taking of minnows (see minnow regulations, Section 12 of this order);

By crab traps with the entrance of the trap not to exceed  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches in diameter in the following named counties:

and up to a point five miles inland on all rivers and streams located in Oconto county which flow into the waters of Green Bay.

(3) (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to set, place or operate any crayfish trap in any stream inhabited by trout.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person to set, place or operate any crayfish trap from March 1 to July 14, both dates inclusive, in, on and along all that part of Little Lake Butte des Morts and the Fox river in Winnebago and Outagamie counties beginning at the outlet of Lake Winnebago and extending downstream to the upper Appleton dam in Section 35, Township 21 North, Range 17 East, in the city of Appleton, including all connecting sloughs, bayous and backwaters.

(4) Frogs. (a) The open season for taking, killing or capturing frogs shall be from April 30 to December 31, both dates inclusive.

(b) All frogs taken legally during the open season may be held, purchased, and sold during the closed season. Persons engaged in the business of propagating frogs may possess and sell frogs at any time.

(c) There shall be no open season for bullfrogs in Jefferson and Walworth counties.

#### Section 9. PROHIBITED FISHING UNDER PARTICULAR CONDITIONS.

(1) (a) Waters and methods. No person shall take, capture, or kill fish of any variety or fish for fish during the closed season for trout in streams and creeks containing trout.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person to take, capture, or kill fish or fish for fish of any variety at any time in the inland waters of this state from a motor-driven boat when the motor is running or from any boat in tow of a motor-driven boat when the motor is running or from any sailboat when in motion; or by means of shutting or drawing off water for that purpose.

(c) Fishing near dams. It shall be unlawful for any person to take, capture, or kill fish of any variety or fish for fish by means other than with hook and line within two hundred feet of any fishway, lock, or dam in the inland waters at any time.

(2) It shall be unlawful for any person to fish in any manner during the open season for waterfowl in all that part of Puckaway lake and the Fox river beginning at the boundary line between Marquette and Green Lake counties and extending downstream to mile post #63, sometimes known as Johnson creek, in Green Lake county, Camp lake in Kenosha county, Browns and Eagle lakes in Racine county, and the Sheboygan Marsh in Sheboygan county except that it shall be lawful to fish from the shore, and from piers in such waters at all times during the open season established by this order.

#### Section 10. PROHIBITED METHODS OF FISHING

(1) (a) No person shall take, catch, kill or fish for fish of any variety with more than two lines or two poles with one line attached to each pole and with one bait to each line except that fly fishermen may use two flies to one line or with any fish line or lines unattended in any of the inland waters of the state or by snagging or fouling with any hook or by means other than angling and trolling except as otherwise provided by the Wisconsin statutes or by commission order; nor shall any person use a spear or bow and arrow for the purpose of taking, catching, or killing any fish at any time in inland waters containing trout or from sunset to sunrise in any inland waters. Rough fish only may be taken by means of a spear or bow and arrow. Burbot or lawyers but no other species of fish may be taken by means of spears from sunset to sunrise in the waters of the Amnicon and

Nemadji rivers in Douglas county and the Bad river in Ashland county from December 15 to January 15 only. All species of fish of any size but subject to the bag limits and other regulations for each species of fish as set forth in this order may be taken in the natural channel of the Chippewa river from the Jim Falls dam downstream to the county highway "S" bridge in Chippewa county by any means except poisons, explosives, or stupefactive. It shall be lawful to take rough fish by hand at any time in all waters.

(2) (a) No person shall have in his possession or under his control on any of the inland waters or shores of inland waters at any time in the counties of Ashland, Barron, Bayfield, Burnett, Douglas (except in the Amnicon and Nemadji rivers from December 15 to January 15, both dates inclusive), Iron, Marinette in that portion of the county west of Highway "41" only, Oconto in that portion of the county west of Highway "141" only, Oneida, Pierce, Polk, Price, Rusk, St. Croix, Sawyer, Taylor, Vilas and Washburn any spear, gun or similar device that might be used for the purpose of taking, catching or killing fish.

(b) No person shall have in his possession or under his control on any of the inland waters or shores of inland waters of the counties of Adams, Brown, Buffalo, Calumet, Chippewa, Clark, Columbia, Dane, Door, Dunn, Eau Claire, Florence, Forest, Green, Iowa, Jackson, Juneau, Kenosha, Kewaunee, LaCrosse, Langlade, Lincoln, Manitowoc, Marathon, Marinette in that portion of the county east of Highway "41" only, Monroe, Oconto in that portion of the county east of Highway "141" only, Pepin, Portage, Racine, Rock, Sauk, Shawano, Trempealeau, Vernon, Walworth, Washington, Waukesha, and Wood in the nighttime, sunset to sunrise, nor at any time from March 2 to April 30, inclusive, nor at any time on any stream or creek containing trout, any gun, spear or similar device, that might be used for the purpose of taking, catching or killing fish.

(c) It shall be lawful for any person to take rough fish by means of spears or bow and arrow at any time of the year during daylight hours, sunrise to sunset in the inland waters or shores of inland waters of the counties of Crawford, Dodge, Grant, Green Lake, Fond du Lac, Jefferson, Lafayette, Marquette, Milwaukee, Outagamie, Ozaukee, Richland, Sheboygan, Waupaca, Waushara and Winnebago. It shall be unlawful to have in possession any spear, gun or bow and arrow or similar device that might be used for the purpose of taking, catching or killing fish on any stream or creek containing trout at any time of the year, day or night. However, suckers and carp may be speared during the daytime, sunrise to sunset only, from March 15 to May 1, both dates inclusive in the following trout waters:

1. The White river below where the east and west branches of the White river join in the southeast quarter of the northeast quarter of Section 10, Township 18 North, Range 10 East, in the Town of Dakota to the Marquette county line.

2. Willow creek between the point where the two branches of said stream unite in Section 12, Township 18 North, Range 11 East, Town of Marion, and Lake Poygan.

3. The Pine river between the point where the said stream crosses the highway in Section 3, Township 19 North, Range 12 East, Town of Leon, and Lake Poygan, all in Waushara county.

4. Panfish and rough fish may be taken by the method commonly known as skin diving by divers under the water with the use of spears or spear guns in the following waters: Crooked and Jordan lakes in Adams county; Lake Arbutus in Clark and Jackson counties; Lake Mendota in Dane county; Wolf and Helen lakes in Portage county; Lake Seven and Lake Ellen in Sheboygan county; Lake Geneva in Walworth county; Cyclone and Mathews lakes in Washburn county; Lake Five and Wallace lake in Washington county; Stratton and Spenser lakes in Waupaca county.

(3) Possession of goldfish. It shall be unlawful for any person to use goldfish in any form or manner for bait, or have goldfish in possession on the inland and outlying waters of this state.

(4) Snag lines. No person shall set, place, use or operate or have in possession or under control any snag line or snag pole, snag hook or parts thereof or cluster of fish hooks that might be attached to same designed to be placed in or drawn through the water for the purpose of catching or drawing such hooks into the body of fish or used for that purpose; except that carp, but no other species or variety of fish, may be taken by means of a gaff hook through the ice in the daytime only (sunrise to sunset) in the outlying and reserve waters of Lake Michigan and Green Bay.

(5) Turtle traps. Hoop net turtle traps with a mesh of not less than 7 inch stretch measure providing such traps are so set that not less than 2 inches of the hoops extend above the surface of the water, and float and tank type turtle traps not exceeding 4 feet square or 4 feet in diameter may be used for trapping turtles. Each such trap while in use shall have attached thereto in such manner as to be visible and legible at all times, a metal tag bearing the name and address of the operator of such trap and it shall be unlawful for any other person to tend or operate such trap.

#### Section 11. DIP NETS IN INLAND WATERS.

(1) General restrictions. Except as provided in this section and in Sections 7, 12, and 13 of this order, no person shall set, use, or operate any dip net in any of the inland waters of the state for taking, catching, or killing any variety of fish. No person while operating a dip net for rough fish shall fish for fish in any other manner at that time.

There shall be a daily bag limit and a possession limit of twenty-five suckers per person taken under the provisions of this section and no suckers so taken shall be sold or bartered in any manner. There is no bag limit on other species of rough fish.



(2) Use of dip nets. (a) Dip nets used for taking, catching, or killing rough fish shall be defined as follows: a piece of netting suspended from a round or square frame not exceeding 8 feet in diameter or 8 feet square and making a bag when lifted not more than 4 feet deep. It shall be unlawful to use dip nets in any manner other than raising and lowering vertically when fishing.

(b) Marinette and Oconto counties. Not more than one dip net per person may be used all year for the taking, catching, or killing of rough fish in the daytime only from sunrise to sunset in Marinette and Oconto counties in all of the streams and rivers flowing into Green Bay from a point two hundred feet upstream from the mouth, and extending a distance of ten miles inland in a straight line.

(c) Door, Kewaunee, Brown, Manitowoc, Sheboygan, Ozaukee, Milwaukee, Racine and Kenosha counties. One dip net per person may be used all year for the taking, catching and killing of rough fish in the following waters: in any of the streams (but not the lakes) of Door, Kewaunee, Brown, Manitowoc and Sheboygan counties except the tributaries of the Kewaunee river, the West Twin or Neshoto river and its tributaries above the dam at Shoto, the East Twin or Mishicot river and its tributaries above the dam at Mishicot and the Manitowoc river and its tributaries above the dam at Manitowoc Rapids and the Fox river in Brown county from 50 feet below the railroad bridge upstream to the dam at DePere; in all the non-trout streams and rivers flowing into Lake Michigan in Ozaukee, Milwaukee, Racine, and Kenosha counties in that part of each of such streams beginning at the mouth and extending upstream to a point five hundred feet below the first dam located on any such stream.

(d) Fond du Lac county. One dip net per person may be used in the daytime only, from May 1 to March 15, for taking, catching or killing rough fish, except suckers, in that part of the Fond du Lac river in Fond du Lac county beginning at its mouth and extending upstream three miles.

(e) Dodge and Jefferson counties. One dip net per person may be used in the daytime only for the taking, catching or killing of rough fish, except suckers, all year, in the following waters:

1. In the Rock river in Dodge and Jefferson counties.
2. In the Crawfish river in Jefferson county.
3. In Beaver Dam lake in Dodge county.

(f) Calumet county. One dip net per person may be used from May 1 to May 31, both dates inclusive for the removal of rough fish from that part of Lake Winnebago within a distance of 500 feet from the shoreline of Calumet county.

(3) Smelt. (a) Dip nets not exceeding eight feet in diameter or eight feet square may be used at any time for the taking, catching, or killing of smelt in all the streams and rivers flowing into Lake Michigan and the northern and southern parts of Green Bay, with the exception of the Fox river in Brown county from 50 feet below the

railroad bridge upstream to the dam in the city of DePere, in that part of each of such streams beginning at or in the bay or lake and extending upstream to a point 500 feet below the first dam located on any such stream or a distance of five miles inland on any of such streams where no dam is located within five miles of the mouth.

(b) Dip nets not exceeding eight feet in diameter or eight feet square, may be used from April 1 to May 25 for the taking, catching, or killing of smelt and suckers in all streams flowing into Lake Superior in Bayfield, Ashland and Iron counties and the Brule river in Douglas county from a point beginning at their mouths and extending inland for a distance of one-half mile in a straight line. Zoning does not apply on Bear creek, Bluff creek and the Nemadji river, the St. Louis river and the other non-trout streams in Douglas county and in the waters of the Chippewa, Bad, and White rivers in Ashland county not inhabited by trout.

(c) Seines not more than 75 feet in length and not more than 6 feet in depth may be used from April 1 to May 25 for the taking, catching, and killing of smelt and suckers in all the outlying waters except that portion of the Fox river in Brown county from 50 feet below the railroad bridge upstream to the dam in the city of DePere.

#### Section 12. MINNOW NETS AND TRAPS.

(1) Use limited. No person shall set, use, or operate any minnow seine, minnow dip net or minnow traps in any of the inland waters of this state for taking, catching, or killing fish of any variety, other than as specified in this section.

(2) Possession limit. It shall be unlawful for any person to take in any waters in any one day more minnows than are specified in subsection (4) (c). The possession and transportation of minnows legally taken is permitted throughout the state.

(3) Mud minnows. There shall be a closed season for the taking of mud minnows from January 15 to April 25, both dates inclusive. There shall be no bag limit on mud minnows taken from any inland waters.

(4) Inland waters. (a) The following described gear only may be used for the taking of minnows for bait:

1. Minnow seines. Minnow seines shall not exceed 25 feet in length, 5 feet in depth, and shall contain mesh not to exceed  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch stretch measure.

2. Minnow dip nets. Minnow dip nets shall be defined as follows: A piece of netting suspended from a round or square frame not exceeding 6 feet in diameter or 6 feet square and making a bag when lifted not more than 4 feet deep. It shall be unlawful to use dip nets in any manner other than raising and lowering vertically when fishing.

3. Minnow traps. Minnow traps shall be of a length not greater than 24 inches and a diameter of not more than 16 inches with an opening in the throat of the trap not larger than  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches in diameter. Such traps shall have securely attached to them a label or tag clearly bearing in the English language the name and address of the operator. All minnow traps shall be raised and the minnows removed from them at least once in every 24 hours.

(b) It shall be unlawful to use minnow seines, minnow dip nets or minnow traps of any type or description in any inland waters inhabited by trout except that not to exceed three minnow traps may be used in all trout waters during the open season for trout.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any person, except bait dealers licensed pursuant to section 29.137 of the statutes, to have in possession or under control more than 600 minnows at any time.

#### Section 13. WHITEFISH AND CISCO IN INLAND WATERS.

(1) The rules and regulations set forth in this section shall apply to the use of whitefish and cisco dip nets and seines licensed pursuant to section 29.35 of the Wisconsin statutes.

(2) Such dip nets shall not exceed 8 feet in diameter or 8 feet square and such seines shall not exceed 75 feet in length or 6 feet in depth and with a mesh not greater than 2 inches stretch measure.

(3) The open season for fishing whitefish and cisco with such dip nets and seines in inland waters shall be from October 10 to January 15 inclusive.

(4) No person shall have in possession or under control at any time more than 25 pounds of whitefish or cisco taken from inland waters.

#### Section 14. SET LINES AND SET OR BANK POLES IN INLAND WATERS

(1) The rules and regulations set forth in this section shall apply to the use of set lines and set or bank poles licensed pursuant to sections 29.36 and 29.37 of the Wisconsin statutes and it shall be unlawful for any person to set, place, lift or attend any licensed set line or set or bank pole in any of the inland waters except as provided in this section.

(2) At each end of every licensed set line when set in any of the inland waters there shall be placed and maintained a white flag not less than 16 inches square with the upper end of the staff extending at least 2 feet above the water and numbered with figures at least 3 inches in height corresponding to the number of the license authorizing the use of such set line.

(3) No set line or set or bank pole shall be equipped with hooks of a size smaller than 5/0.

(4) It shall be unlawful to set, place, lift, attend or have in possession while on any of the inland waters of the state any licensed set line from sunset to sunrise or any unlicensed set line at any time.

(5) Licensed set lines equipped with not more than 100 hooks and set or bank poles may be used from May 20 to October 15 in the waters of Lake Winnebago, Lake Butte des Morts, Little Lake Butte des Morts, Lake Winneconne, Lake Poygan, in the Wolf river downstream from the mouth of the Rat river in Winnebago county, in the Fox river downstream from Highway 21 bridge in the city of Omro to the dam in the city of DePere. On such set lines it shall be unlawful to use any frog, crayfish or fish or part thereof except that a square chunk cut from rough fish may be used. There shall be no bag limit on catfish in the waters defined in this subsection.

(6) Licensed set lines equipped with not more than 25 hooks and set or bank poles may be used from May 20 to October 15 in the following waters: The Wolf river from 500 feet below the dam at Shawano in Shawano county downstream to the mouth of the Rat river in Winnebago county, the Fox river from mile post #63, sometimes known as Johnson creek in Green Lake county downstream to Highway 21 bridge in the city of Omro in Winnebago county, the Wisconsin river from the north line of Sauk county to its mouth, the Black river downstream from the Highway 12 bridge in the city of Black River Falls, and the Kickapoo river in Crawford county. Licensed, set or bank poles only may be used from May 20 to October 15 in the east and west branches of the Pecatonica river in Lafayette county and in the Pecatonica river in Green county. It shall be unlawful for any person to use as bait on such set lines or set or bank poles any frog, crayfish or fish or part thereof except that in the Wisconsin river from the Prairie du Sac dam downstream to its mouth, in the Wolf river in Shawano, Waupaca, Outagamie and Winnebago counties from 500 feet below the dam at Shawano downstream to the Rat river in Winnebago county, in the Fox river from mile post #63, sometimes known as Johnson creek in Green Lake county downstream to the Highway 21 bridge at Omro, in the Pecatonica river in Lafayette and Green counties and in the Kickapoo river in Crawford county from 200 feet below the dam at Gays Mills downstream to its mouth it shall be legal to use live bait of a minimum size of 6 inches or larger on set lines or set or bank poles. The bag and size limits established in the season tables shall apply except that there shall be no bag limit on catfish in the waters defined in subsection (4), and in the Wolf and Fox river waters defined in this subsection.

(7) For the purpose of this section catfish taken by set lines or set or bank poles in the following waters shall not be construed to be game fish and may be sold: The Wisconsin river downstream from the north line of Sauk county to its mouth; Lake Winnebago, Lake Butte des Morts, Little Lake Butte des Morts, Lake Winneconne, Lake Poygan and the river connecting said lakes; the Wolf river downstream from 500 feet below the dam at Shawano; and the Fox river from the Princeton locks downstream to the dam in the city of DePere.

Section 15. FISH SHANTIES, SHELTERS, ICE FISHING HOURS AND ICE FISHING IN OUTLYING WATERS. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the following rules and regulations are hereby established for the use of buildings, vehicles, tents, fish shanties, and similar enclosures and shelters maintained, occupied or used for fishing purposes on the ice of any inland waters pursuant to section 29.283 of the Wisconsin statutes:

(1) Prohibited shelter. Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section no person shall construct, use, maintain or occupy for fishing purposes any building, vehicle, tent, fish shanty, or similar enclosure or shelter whatsoever upon the ice of any inland waters of the state.

(2) Fish shanties. (a) Buildings, vehicles, tents, fish shanties, portable shelters or similar enclosures may be used on the ice for fishing purposes. The door of any such enclosure or shelter shall be equipped with a latch which will permit the door to be readily opened from the outside at all times while enclosure or shelter is occupied. All such shelters shall be removed from the ice on or before March 15 on all waters listed in this subsection or previous to that time by order of the conservation commission or by its agents when they feel that the ice has become unsafe for travel thereon.

(b) Buildings, vehicles, tents, fish shanties, or similar enclosures may be used on the ice for fishing purposes on Allouez Bay, St. Louis Bay, St. Louis river and Superior Bay in Douglas county and Chequamegon Bay in Ashland and Bayfield counties from the time the ice forms; provided, however, that all such enclosures or shelters shall be removed from the ice on or before March 15 of each year.

(3) Ice fishing hours. No person shall take, catch or kill fish or fish for fish of any variety through the ice with hook and line from 8:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m. of the following morning in any of the inland waters of the state.

(4) Name of owner. All buildings, tents, fish shanties, and similar enclosures or shelters maintained, occupied, or used for fishing purposes on the ice of any inland waters and the outlying waters of Chequamegon Bay where so authorized by the conservation commission or by statute shall have in the English language the name and address of the person owning or using the same painted on the outside thereof in such manner as to be readily seen and read at all times.

(5) Ice fishing in outlying waters. The same seasons, bag limits, and size limits are established for fishing through the ice in the outlying waters of this state as are established under the general fishing seasons for outlying waters as set forth in section 5 of this order.

Section 16. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that no provisions in this order shall prohibit the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin, its agents, deputy conservation wardens or representatives of the fish management division of such commission from taking any of the fish

mentioned in any of the sections of this order at any time wherein they deem it advisable and necessary to promote the general conservation progress.

Section 17. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this order shall be upon approval of the Governor, and after publication in the official state paper, namely the Wisconsin State Journal of Madison, Wisconsin, effective beginning September 8, 1955.

Section 18. THIS ORDER was made and passed by the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin at a meeting duly called and held by said commission in Wautoma, Wisconsin, this 8th day of July, 1955.

Section 19. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this order is declared to be severable and should any part or section thereof be declared unconstitutional or otherwise invalid the remainder of the order shall not be affected.

Section 20. IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Acting Director of the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin be, and he is hereby authorized and directed by said commission to sign this order for and on behalf of the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin.
