**Med 30.01 Preliminary requirements.** An applicant for registration as a chiropractor in this state must present satisfactory evidence of a preliminary education equivalent to graduation from an accredited high school of this state, and of having completed one year in a college of liberal arts or science recognized by the university of Wisconsin.

**Med 30.02 Professional requirements.** An applicant for registration as a chiropractor in this state must present a diploma from a reputable school of chiropractor. The board approves and recognizes as reputable schools those schools offering a course at least equivalent to four years of thirty-two weeks of thirty class hours each, and in addition, must be recognized and approved by the council on education of the national association of chiropractors.

**Med 30.03 Registration examination.** Each applicant for registration as a chiropractor in this state is required to present to the board with his application for examination, notarized photographic copies of:

- (1) High school diploma.
- (2) Certified statement of credits for one year in a college of liberal arts and sciences, bearing seal of the school of issuance.
- (3) Professional diploma.
- (4) Unmounted, recent photograph of applicant with an affidavit on the reverse side, made by the applicant and the photographer, that the photo is that of the applicant and that his signature appears on the reverse of the photo. The affidavit of the photographer should be notarized.
- (5) Fee of \$25.00.
- (6) Satisfactory evidence of good moral and professional character.

**Med 30.04 Minimum age.** Applicants for certificate of registration to practice chiropractor shall be at least 21 years of age.

**Med 30.05 Language for examinations.** Examinations are conducted only in the English language, and are oral and written.
