ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.085 and 29.174, Wis. Stats., the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby amends and adopts rules as follows:

Section WCD 10.01 (4) (c), (d) and (f) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

S. highway 51, Dodge, Jefferson, Kenosha, Kewaunee, Milwaukee, Outagamie, Ozaukee, Racine, that part of Rock (county) lying east of U. S. highway 51, that part of Sauk (county) lying east and north of U. S. highway 16, that part of Sheboygan (county) lying west and north of a line beginning at the junction of county highway "J" with the north boundary of said county, thence southeasterly along said highway "J" to its junction with county highway "P" thence southerly along said highway "P" to its junction with county highway "C", thence westerly along said highway "C" to its junction with the west boundary of said county, Walworth, Washington, Waukesha and Winnebago	None	.....

The skins of all beaver taken in the aforesaid open season beginning on March 27 and extending through April 10 shall be tagged pursuant to section 29.132, Wis. Stats., in the county where trapped.

(f) Tagging of otter pelt and carcass. The pelt and carcass of all otter taken by any trapper shall be exhibited to a conservation warden by the trapper within 5 days after the close of the otter trapping season. The conservation warden shall thereupon attach and lock to each such pelt a metal tag and it shall be unlawful for any person to have in possession or under control any otter pelt taken during such open season without such tag attached as provided herein. For each such otter carcass surrendered to the conservation warden the state conservation commission will pay to the trapper the sum of \$2. Such pelts and carcasses taken during the aforesaid open season for trapping otter beginning on March 27 and extending through April 10 shall be exhibited and tagged as provided herein in the county where trapped.

Section WCD 11.175 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WCD 11.175 CLOSED AREA; BEAVER AND OTTER. It shall be unlawful for any person to trap any species of wild animals on the following described area during that period of time beginning February 25 and ending March 26:

(1) BUFFALO COUNTY. (a) Tiffany

Section 22 - All that part lying east of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific railroad.

Section 23 - Entire section.

Sections 24 and 25 - All that part lying west of state highway 25.

Section 26 - Entire section.

Section 27 - All that part lying east of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific railroad.

Section 34 - All that part lying east of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific railroad and north of the Chicago, Burlington, and Quincy railroad.

Section 35 - Entire section except that part lying south of the Chicago, Burlington, and Quincy railroad.

Section 36 - All that part lying north of state highway 35 and west of state highway 25.

Township 24 north, range 13 west, town of Maxville.

Section 7 - All that part of the  $W\frac{1}{2}$  of the  $SW\frac{1}{4}$  lying west of state highway 25.

Sections 18 and 19 - All that part lying west of state highway 25.

Sections 30 and 31 - All that part lying west of state highway 25.

Township 24 north, range 14 west, town of Maxville.

Section 12 - All that part lying south and east of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific railroad.

Section 13 - Entire section except that part lying west of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific railroad.

Section 23 - All that part lying south and east of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific railroad.

Section 24 - Entire section except that part lying west of the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific railroad.

Section 25 - Entire section.  
Section 26 - All that part lying east of the Chicago, Milwaukee,  
St. Paul and Pacific railroad.  
Section 35 - All that part lying east of the Chicago, Milwaukee,  
St. Paul and Pacific railroad.  
Section 36 - Entire section.

February 25, 1957.
