ORDER OF THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE
AMENDING AND ADOPTING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Department of Agriculture by sections 93.07 (1) and (12), Wis. Stats., the State Department of Agriculture hereby amends and adopts rules as follows:

SECTION 1. Section Ag 27.03 (1) of the Wisconsin administrative code is amended to read:

Ag 27.03 (1) Potatoes, general. (1) No person shall plant any potatoes on any infested control area, unless the department has granted written authority for planting. Any potatoes found growing on any infested control area without such authority shall be destroyed. The designation and marking of any field as an "infested field" or "infested control area" shall be terminated by the department if it finds that the field has been effectively fumigated and the next crop grown thereon evidences no infestation, or that two successive crops grown thereon evidence no infestation.

SECTION 2. Section Ag 27.04 (7) of the Wisconsin administrative code is adopted to read:

Ag 27.04 (7) Notwithstanding subsections (1) and (3), potatoes may be certified for seed purposes if grown on any field after its status as an infested, exposed or adjacent field has been terminated by the department and the next potato crop grown thereon was inspected and no evidence of potato rot nematode was disclosed.

The rules contained herein shall take effect on June 1, 1960.
