ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING,
AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.085, 29.107 and 23.09, Wisconsin Statutes, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby repeals, amends and adopts rules as follows:

Section WCD 10.01 (4)(c) and (d) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

(c) Beaver

ZONE A

All that part of the state lying north and west of a line beginning at the junction of Highway 8 with the west boundary of said state, thence easterly along said Highway 8 to its junction with State Highway 40, thence northerly along said Highway 40 to its junction with State Highway 70, thence easterly along said Highway 70 to its junction with a town road running northerly from Loretta to Clam Lake and known as the "Loretta Grade", thence northerly along said town road to its junction with County Highway M, thence westerly along said Highway M to its junction with County Highway D, thence northerly along said Highway D to its junction with U. S. Highway 63, thence northerly along said Highway 63 to its junction with U. S. Highway 2, thence northeasterly along said Highway 2 to its junction with the west city limits of Ashland, thence northerly along said city limits to its junction with Lake Superior which is the north boundary of said state - - - - - Feb. 1 through March 15 35 per seas

ZONE B

All that part of the state except Zone A lying westerly of a line beginning at the junction of State Highway 82 extended westerly to the Mississippi river which is the west boundary of the state, thence northeasterly along said Highway 82 to its junction with U. S. Highway 12, thence northwesterly along said Highway 12 to its junction with State Highway 21, thence easterly along said Highway 21 to its junction with State Highway 173, thence northerly along said Highway 173 to its junction with the west boundaries of Juneau and Wood Counties, thence northerly along

said boundaries to their junction with State Highway 54, thence easterly along said Highway 54 to its junction with U. S. Highway 51, thence northerly along said Highway 51 to its junction with U. S. Highway 8, thence easterly along said Highway 8 to its junction with State Highway 17, thence northerly along said Highway 17 to its junction with State Highway 70, thence easterly along said Highway 70 to its junction with U. S. Highway 45, thence northerly along said Highway 45 to its junction with County Highway K, thence westerly along said Highway K to its junction with County Highway M, thence southerly along said Highway M to its junction with U. S. Highway 51, thence northerly along said Highway 51 to its junction with U. S. Highway 2, thence easterly along said Highway 2 to its junction with the Montreal River which is the north boundary of the state, and all that part of the state lying east and north of a line beginning at the junction of County Highway JJ and the Menominee River which is the east boundary of the state, thence westerly along said Highway JJ to its junction with State Highway 180, thence westerly along said Highway 180 to its junction with U. S. Highway 141, thence southerly along said Highway 141 to its junction with State Highway 64, thence westerly along said Highway 64 to its junction with State Highway 32, thence southerly along said Highway 32 to its junction with State Highway 22, thence southerly along said Highway 22 to its junction with U. S. Highway 45, thence southerly along said Highway 45 to its junction with State Highway 54, thence westerly along said Highway 54 to its junction with U. S. All that part of the state lying northerly and easterly of a line beginning at the junction of U. S. Highway 2 and the Montreal River which is the north boundary of the state, thence westerly along said Highway 2 to its junction with U. S. Highway 51, thence southerly along said Highway 51 to its junction with County Highway M, thence northerly along said Highway M to its junction with County Highway K, thence easterly along said Highway K to its junction with U. S. Highway 45, thence southerly along said Highway 45 to its junction with State Highway 70, thence westerly along said Highway 70 to its junction with State Highway 17, thence southerly along said Highway 17 to its junction with U. S. Highway 8, thence westerly along said Highway 8 to its junction with U. S. Highway 51, thence southerly along said Highway 51 to its junction with State Highway 54, thence easterly along said Highway 54 to its junction with U. S. Highway 45, thence northerly along said Highway 45 to its junction with State Highway 22, thence northeasterly along said Highway 22 to its junction with State Highway 32,

S. Highway 12, thence northwesterly along said Highway 12 to its junction with State Highway 21, thence easterly along said Highway 21 to its junction with State Highway 173, thence northerly along said Highway 173 to its junction with the west boundaries of Juneau and Wood Counties, thence northerly along said boundaries to their junction with State Highway 54, thence easterly along said Highway 54 to its junction with U. S. Highway 51, thence southerly along said Highway 51 to its junction with State Highway 33, thence easterly along said Highway 33 to its junction with State Highway 73, thence southerly along said Highway 73 to its junction with U. S. (d) Otter

The opening date for the trapping season for otter shall be concurrent with the opening date for trapping beaver in all zones established under paragraph (c) of this section. The open season for otter trapping shall extend through March 15 in all zones. There shall be no open season in Zone D. The season bag limit is two otter.

Section WCD 10.01 (4)(e) and (f) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

WCD 10.01 (4)(e) Tagging of Otter and Beaver Pelts

Each person who has trapped an otter or beaver during the established open season for such animals shall exhibit each pelt to an authorized representative of the conservation commission in the county in which such animal was trapped, or in the adjoining county, but within the area included within the open season in which such animal was trapped, not later than five days after the close of said season. Said representatives shall inspect the pelt and attach and lock a special tag indicating it has been inspected. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess raw pelts from such animals beginning six days after the close of the season to the opening date of the following season without such tag attached and locked. No person shall transfer, give, trade, sell, or purchase any such pelts without such tag being attached and locked to the head of each pelt.

(f) Muskrats Taken in Beaver or Otter Traps

1. Any person may salvage not to exceed eight muskrats which are taken in beaver or otter traps during the open season for beaver and otter and incidental to the licensee's beaver or otter trapping operations.

2. All such muskrat pelts shall be tagged with a metal tag immediately when the animal is taken; such tags to be furnished by the conservation commission upon request.

3. All muskrat pelts taken pursuant to this section shall be exhibited for inspection, together with any beaver and otter pelts taken, in the same manner as is provided for presenting beaver and otter by paragraph (e) of this section.

The rules, amendments and repeals contained herein shall take effect on February 1, 1963.


