ORDER OF THE WISCONSIN STATE BOARD OF ACCOUNTANCY

Pursuant to authority vested in the Wisconsin State Board of Accountancy by section 135.01 Wis. Stats., the Wisconsin State Board of Accountancy hereby adopts the following rule:

Accy. 3.02 (3) is renumbered to be 3.02 (4)


Accy. 3.02 (3) of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE is created to read:

(3) Applicants who have completed educational training as an accounting major in a four year day course in business administration in a degree granting school with educational standards in accounting, commerce, general education, and training substantially equivalent to those for an accounting major in the School of Commerce of the University of Wisconsin will be permitted to write the examinations beginning with the first examination following their graduation and after having completed one year of public accounting or its equivalent, but no certificate will be issued until all other requirements of this paragraph are met.

The rules, amendments, and repeals contained herein shall take effect on April 1, 1963, as provided in section 227.026 (1) Wis. Stats.
