ORDER OF THE WISCONSIN STATE BOARD OF PHARMACY AMENDING RULE PHAR. 3.04

Pursuant to the authority vested in the State Board of Pharmacy by Section 151.01, Wis. Stats., the Board hereby amends its rules as follows:

Section Phar. 3.04 of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE is amended to read as follows:

Phar. 3.04 Reciprocity. (1) Applications for reciprocal registration (registration as a pharmacist on the basis of licensure as a pharmacist in another state) shall be filed with the Secretary of the Board at least 30 days prior to the date said application is to be considered by the Board.

(2) Applicants for resiprosal registration, in addition to satisfying the conditions of Section 151.02(6), Wis. State., shall have been licensed as pharmacist for at least one year.

(The one-year requirement may be weived for an applicant from a state having reciprocal relations with Wisconsin when said state does not require same of Wisconsin applicants for reciprocal registration.)

- (3) Applicants for reciprocal registration who have not been actively engaged in the practice of pharmacy within the year preceding the submission of their application shall be required to show their proficiency in the compounding and dispensing of medication.
- (h) Applicants for reciprocal registration shall be required to display their familiarity with the laws regulating the practice of Pharmacy in Wisconsin by submitting to a written and oral examination on the Wisconsin laws and regulations and the Federal laws and regulations governing the practice of Pharmacy.

The amendment contained herein shall take effect on April 1, 1963 as provided for in section 227,026.
