ORDER OF THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH

AMENDING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Board of Health by Sections 140.05 (3) and 146.19 (2), Wisconsin Statutes, the State Board of Health hereby amends Sub-sections H 76.03 (2), H 76.04 (5), H 76.04 (7), H 76.05 (2), H 76.08 (1), H 76.10 (2) and Section H 76.12 of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE relative to Minimum Standards for Wisconsin Migrant Labor Camps as follows:

Sub-section H 76.03 (2) is amended to read:

H 76.03 (2) The camp shall be so laid out that no dwelling unit shall be located farther than 200 feet from a toilet and service building as required herein, and walkways to such service buildings, other than portable buildings, shall be graveled or paved unless the surface is a well drained sand or sod in which case a slotted or perforated removable landing or permanent concrete slab having a width and depth not less than the width of the door opening shall be located at the entrance to each dwelling unit. Walkways shall be well lighted at night.

Sub-section H 76.04 (5) is amended to read:

H 76.04 (5) Each dwelling unit, other than tents, used during the mosquito and fly season shall have all exterior openings protected with 16 mesh screen. Screen doors should open outward and shall be self-closing. Tent openings shall be provided with mosquito netting.

Sub-section H 76.04 (7) is amended to read:

H 76.04 (7) Every room in every dwelling unit shall be maintained in a reasonably clean and safe condition.

Sub-section H 76.05 (2) is amended to read:

H 76.05 (2) Every habitable room excepting house trailers furnished by a person other than occupant shall be not less than 7 feet in height from floor to the ceiling. House trailers furnished by other than the occupant shall be not less than 6 feet, 3 inches in height from floor to ceiling. No floor space shall be counted where the ceiling height is less than 5 feet.

Sub-section H 76.08 (1) is amended to read:

H 76.08 (1) An adequate supply of pure water with supply outlets located not more than 200 feet from any dwelling unit shall be furnished for drinking and domestic purposes in all camps. Where a public water supply is not available, the well or wells supplying the camp shall comply with the Wisconsin well

construction code. Supply outlets may be located in the service building, if separate from toilet, shower and laundry rooms.

Sub-section H 76.10 (2) is amended to read:

H 76.10 (2) Substantial fly-tight, leak-proof metal garbage and refuse depositories from which the contents shall be removed and disposed of in a sanitary manner at least twice weekly between May 1 and October 15, and otherwise weekly, shall be provided in sufficient number. The storage area for garbage and refuse containers shall be maintained in a clean and sanitary manner. Containers shall be reasonably clean and show no evidence of accumulated grease of long standing. Facilities for washing containers shall be provided.

Section H 76.12 is amended to read:

H 76.12 Inspection. All dwelling units in migrant labor camps shall be open to inspection at all reasonable hours by representatives of the local and state board of health. The inspector shall make his presence known to the camp owner or operator or an adult member of the owner's or operator's immediate family or the person designated pursuant to H 76,11 (3) as responsible for compliance with these standards.

The amendments contained herein shall take effect on October 1, 1963 as provided in Section 227.026 (1), Wis. Stats.,

subject to approval under the provisions of Section 14.225,
Wis. Stats.
