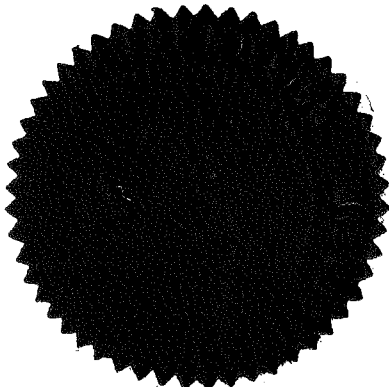

The kill of Canada geese in the area described in WCD 10.01 (1) (a) and (b) has been determined by the Conservation Director to have reached a total of 11,000 birds and pursuant to Section WCD 10.01 (1) (e) 2, and in the interest of public welfare the season in such area should be closed at this time.

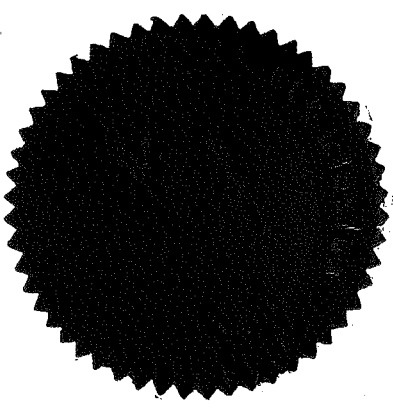

The amendment contained herein shall take effect the day of publication in the official state paper as provided in Section 227.027, Wis. Stats., as an emergency rule. Facts constituting the emergency are as follows:

The average daily kill of Canada geese in the area described in Section WCD 10.01 (1) (a) and (b) has exceeded the maximum number determined necessary to maintain an open season for hunting Canada geese for the period necessary to provide maximum hunting opportunity and to reduce agriculture depredations to a minimum in the area described in Section WCD 10.01 (a) and (b) and in the interest of the public welfare the season in the area described in Section WCD 10.01 (1) (a) should remain open on odd-numbered days of the month only.

Also included is a correction of an error in the present Administrative Code in the Eau Claire Lakes closed area in Douglas County.

The preservation of the public safety and welfare necessitates the adoption of such rules as emergency rules.

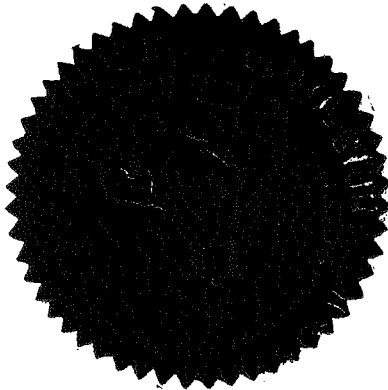

ADOPTING, AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the Conservation Director of the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by Sections 29.174 (4a), 23.09, and 227.027, Wis. Stats., the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby amends rules as follows:

Section WCB 10.01 (3) (e) Zone II of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

Zone II:

The counties or parts of counties of Buffalo, that part of Clark west of U. S. Highway 12, Dunn, that part of Eau Claire west of U. S. Highway 12, that part of Jackson west of U. S. Highway 12 and State Highway 27, La Crosse, that part of Monroe west of State Highways 27 and 33, Pepin, Pierce, St. Croix, Trempealeau and Vernon except that part lying east of State Highway 131 in townships 13 and 14 north.

a. In the counties of Buffalo, Dunn, Pepin, Pierce and St. Croix.

Shotgun season . . . . .	Nov. 21 through Nov. 22	One deer per season, either sex
	Nov. 23 through Nov. 29	One buck deer per season with an antler not less than 3 inches in length

b. In Vernon county except that part lying east of State Highway 131 in townships 13 and 14 north.

Firearm season . . . . .	Nov. 21 through Nov. 22	One deer per season, either sex
	Nov. 23 through Nov. 29	One buck deer per season with an antler not less than 3 inches in length

c. In the remainder of Zone II.

Shotgun season . . . . .	Nov. 21 through Nov. 22	One deer per season, either sex
Firearm season . . . . .	Nov. 23 through Nov. 29	One buck deer per season with an antler not less

Section WCD 10.115 (7) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is created to read:

(7) All permits remaining unissued for any designated quota area after all applications filed pursuant to paragraphs (5) and (6) have been processed may be issued by the Conservation Director on a first-come, first-served basis to deer hunting parties duly applying therefor. Such applications may be made in person by the deer hunting party leader or by mailing the application to the Conservation Director. Deer hunting parties who had previously applied for but did not receive a permit under paragraph (6) may make application hereunder for an unissued permit but such application shall include the identical party members who made the previous application under paragraph (6).

The amendment contained herein shall take effect the day following publication in the official state paper as provided in Section 227.027, Wis. Stats., as an emergency rule. Facts constituting the emergency are as follows:

Applications for the deer hunting party permits in specified quota areas which have been received are less than the total number of permits available. In the interest of the public welfare such unissued permits should be made available so as to assure a proper cropping of deer in all quota areas in order that a strong and healthy deer herd may be maintained and conserved in keeping with the available deer food supply and deer habitat and to insure to the citizens of the state continued opportunities for good hunting.

An error in Order No. G-984 resulted in a shotgun season in Vernon County. The change under this Order will correct this error and provide a firearm season during the deer season.

The preservation of the public safety and welfare necessitates the adoption of such rules as emergency rules.
