(7) All permits remaining unissued for any designated quota area after all applications filed pursuant to paragraphs (5) and (6) have been processed may be issued by the Conservation Director on a first-come, first-served basis to deer hunting parties duly applying therefor. Such applications may be made in person by the deer hunting party leader or by mailing the application to the Conservation Director. Deer hunting parties who had previously applied for but did not receive a permit under paragraph (6) may make application hereunder for an unissued permit but such application shall include the identical party members who made the previous application under paragraph (6).

The amandment contained herein shall take effect the day following publication in the official state paper as provided in Section 227.027, Wis. Stats., as an emergency rule. Facts constituting the emergency are as follows:

Applications for the deer hunting party permits in specified quota areas which have been received are less than the total number of permits available. In the interest of the public velfere such unissued permits should be made available so as to assure a proper cropping of deer in all quota areas in order that a strong and healthy deer hard may be maintained and conserved in keeping with the available deer food supply and deer habitat and to insure to the citizens of the state continued opportunities for good hunting.

An error in Order No. G-980 resulted in a shotgum season in Vernon County. The change under this Order will correct this error and provide a firearm season during the deer season.

The preservation of the public safety and welfare necessitates the adoption of such rules as emergency rules.
