Chapter WP 2

Aquatic Nuisance Control

(4) Supervisory Fee Charged by the Committee on Water Pollution

Under either option the treatment must be supervised by a representative of the Committee on Water Pollution. The statutes provide that a charge must be made for this supervision, and that said charge shall be sufficient to reimburse the Committee for the actual cost of services rendered, plus 10% for overhead and development work (Wisconsin Statutes 144.53(3), 1947). Said supervisory charge shall be established by the Committee on Water Pollution at its annual meeting in January. Supervision shall begin at the time so designated or agreed upon by the operator or sponsor and the supervisor. All preparatory work, with the exception of the pre-treatment inspection and supervision, is considered fundamental for proper supervision and no separate charge is made for this service.
