IN THE MATTER of repealing and recreating section WCD 10.01 (4) (c) and (d), amending sections WCD 10.01 (introductory paragraph) and WCD (introductory paragraph) and WCD (b) and (e) and creating section WCD (b) and (e) and creating section WCD (li.17 (5)) of the wisconsin administrative Code relating to trapping seasons for beaver and otter, closed areas, and shooting preserve regulations.

ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN ADOPTING,

AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.085, 29.107 and 23.09, Wisconsin Statutes, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby repeals, amends and adopts rules as follows:

Section WCD 10.01 (Introductory paragraph) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.01 Upen and Closed Jeasons

A closed season is established for each species of wild animal and bird named herein extending during all the time of each year except the open season period embraced within the specified dates, both inclusive. Such open season shall apply to all of the area described in each locality except as otherwise provided in chapters **GD** ll and **GD** l5, **is. Adm. Code. Except as otherwise expressly provided, no person shall take, catch, kill, hunt, pursue, shoot, or trap any wild animal or bird at any time other than the open season and the established hunting hours therefor, nor in the open season in excess of the daily bag limit designated for each species or each locality, respectively, nor have any such protected wild animal or bird in his possession or under his control in excess of the possession limit.

Wherever open and closed seasons are defined by highways the boundary shall be the center line of the highway, except as otherwise provided.

Section WCD 10.01 (4) (c) and (d) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

(d) Otter

The opening date for the trapping season for otter shall be concurrent with the opening date for trapping beaver in all zones established under paragraph (c) of this section. The open season for trapping otter shall extend through March 15 in all zones. There shall be no open season in 4 one d. The season bag limit is two otter.

Section WCD 19.07 (2), (7) (a) and (b) and (6) (b) and (e) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code are amended to read:

- WCD 19.07 (2) The season for taking pheasants on shooting preserves shall begin concurrent with the general pheasant season in the county or portion thereof in which the preserve is located and shall end on the last day of February. Shooting hours shall be as provided in Section WCD 10.06.
 - (7) (a) All shooting preserve signs posted around licensed shooting preserve areas shall be purchased from the conservation department.
 - (b) Boundaries of the area licensed shall be posted in either of the following manners at the discretion of the licensee:
 - 1. Digns shall be placed at intervals of not more than 400° along the boundary lines of such area, and in addition, such boundary lines shall be clearly defined by at least one strand of wire; or
 - 2. Wherever such boundary lines are not defined by one or more strands of wire, the posting of signs shall be at intervals of not more than 200° along the boundary lines of such areas.
 - (8) (b) All pheasants liberated shall be of high quality stock and not less than 12 weeks of age. Upon written certification by the conservation department representative, listing the number and varieties of pheasants stocked, or placed in holding pens (see (e) below) and the date of such stocking or holding, shooting preserve wing tags shall be furnished by the conservation department at a cost of five cents each to the licensee at a ratio of 75% of the total birds certified. All shooting preserve tags and tag credits shall expire on March 1.

(e) Each pheasant liberated shall have affixed to it a game farm seal or shall be leg banded on the left leg prior to liberation. Any shooting preserve shall be authorized to retain and stock pheasants from an approved holding pen provided such birds have been counted and banded on the left leg and certified to by a conservation department representative. Leg bands will be provided by the commission at cost. The licensee agrees to stock all pheasants so retained.

The rules, amendments and repeals contained herein shall take effect on February 1, 1964.
