ORDER OF THE WISCONSIN BOARD OF EXAMINERS IN WATCHMAKING
AMENDING RULES.

Pursuant to authority vested in the Wisconsin Board of
Examiners in Watchmaking by sections 125.05, 227.014(2), 227.02(1)(e),
Wis. Stats., the agency hereby amends rules as follows:

The Rules with the Amendments are hereby amended to read:

WATCH 1.02 Meetings. The board shall hold at least four meetings
a year at such times and places as the officers may direct.

WATCH 1.08 Applicant's affidavit. Applicants for certificates of
registration by examination shall file with the board an affidavit
that he or she has not violated any of the provisions of Chapter
125, Wis. Stat., together with evidence of completion of an
apprenticeship of 4 years or its equivalent in school training
and practical experience.

In determining the equivalent of an apprenticeship of 4 years, 2
years of full time practical experience will be considered the
equivalent of 1 year of apprenticeship and each $\frac{1}{2}$ year of attendance
in a watchmaking school will be considered the equivalent of 1 year
of apprenticeship but not more than three years credit will be given
for school attendance.

WATCH 1.09 Examination time. A limit of 7 hours shall be given
to applicants to complete the practical examination and 3 hours
to complete the written examination.

WATCH 1.10 Examination. (1) Examinee will be furnished a 16s,
17 jewel, American made pocket watch with the balance staff
broken, hairspring distorted and escapement out of adjustment.
He will fit a balance staff which will be furnished to him, true
the hairspring, adjust the escapement and make all needed repairs.

He will also make a stem to fit a Swiss wrist watch (without sample) and turn a portion of a balance staff to required dimensions.

These amendments shall take effect on the 1st day of March, 1964.
