ORDER OF THE STATE BOARD OF HEALTH

ADOPTING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Board of Health by Sections 140.05 (3) and 50.02, and Chapter 143, Wisconsin Statutes, the State Board of Health hereby repeals and recreates Section H 46.03 of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRA-TIVE CODE relative to tuberculosis cases as follows:

Section H 46.03 is repealed and recreated to read:

Section H 46.03 Tuberculosis cases--environment. Patients should be trained to cover their mouth and nose in coughing and sneezing. The use of disposable napkins should be encouraged; these should be collected in a paper bag lined with a waterproof material and the full bag disposed of by burning. Bed linen and other washable items soiled by sputum of the patients may be washed at home in hot water if they are washed separately from clothes of others in the household. If commercial laundry is used, the soiled articles must be well wrapped and clearly labeled as "contaminated." Upon death or removal of a patient with tuberculosis from the premises, ordinary household cleaning is sufficient to make the premises available for others.

The rule contained herein shall take effect on April 1, 1965 as provided in Section 227.026 (1), Wisconsin Statutes, subject to approval under the provisions of Section 14.225, Wisconsin Statutes.
