

ORDER OF THE STATE CONSERVATION COMMISSION OF WISCONSIN, ADOPTING, AMENDING AND REPEALING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin by sections 29.085, 29.174, 29.107 and 23.09, Wisconsin Statutes, the State Conservation Commission of Wisconsin hereby repeals, amends, and adopts rules as follows:

Section WCD 10.07 (7) (a) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.07 (7) (a) No person shall use or have in his possession or under his control any ferret while hunting, except as provided in this subsection. The owner or occupant of any land where rabbits are found to be doing damage may request from the State Conservation Commission a permit to use a ferret for hunting rabbits thereon.

Section WCD 10.09 (3) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

Section WCD 10.115 (5) and (6) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

WCD 10.115 (5) Except as provided otherwise, the Conservation Director shall distribute for issuance 50% of the total available permits to the county clerk of each county within the quota area described under Wisconsin Administrative Code Section WCD 10.01 (3) (e) 1. 75% of the available permits in that part of said quota area described as deer management unit Nos. 62, 63, 65, 66, 67, 70, and Brown, Calumet, Kewaunee, Manitowoc, and Sheboygan Counties will be distributed to the county clerk of each county within such area for issuance. The number allocated to each county clerk for issuance shall be determined by the Conservation Director and will be in the ratio of the land area of each county in the quota area to the total land area of the quota area.
