ORDER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION

Adopting, Amending, and Repealing Rules

Pursuant to authority vested in the State Superintendent of Public Instruction by Section 115.28(7), Wisconsin Statutes, he hereby repeals, amends, and adopts rules as follows:

Section PI 3.03(4)(b) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read as follows:

PI 3.03(4)(b) Three year licenses will be issued as follows:

1. Business and Office - Vocational.
2. Trades and Industry - Vocational.
3. Distributive Education - Vocational.

Current standards of certification will apply to the above licensing plus appropriate occupational (work) experience required of the licensee.

Unlimited (life) certification is not issued for teaching in the areas listed in this section. A five-year renewable certificate may be granted upon completion of three years of successful teaching of vocational subjects in Wisconsin public junior or senior high schools, during which time said subject(s) were endorsed on a three-year Wisconsin license. At least one of the three years shall have been within the three-year period immediately prior to the application for the five-year certificate. Proof of successful teaching shall be furnished as requested by the state superintendent.
