

ORDER OF THE PHARMACY INTERNSHIP BOARD
ADOPTING AND AMENDING RULES

Pursuant to authority vested in the Pharmacy Internship Board by sections 151.015(2) Wis. Stats., the Internship Board hereby amends and adopts rules as follows:

Sections Ph-Int 1.03(2) of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE are amended to read:


(2) A minimum of at least 10,000 prescriptions should be filled in the pharmacy annually. There may be no more than one intern in training in the pharmacy for each 10,000 prescriptions filled in the pharmacy.

Sections Ph-Int 1.03(5) of the WISCONSIN ADMINISTRATIVE CODE are adopted to read:

(5) The pharmacy shall as part of the pharmaceutical services it renders, establish and maintain medication records for its patients.

The rules and amendments contained herein shall take effect on July 1, 1970 as provided in section 227.026(b).
