continue until 150 deer are killed but not longer than through November 29. The season bag limit shall be one deer of either sex; however, variable quota permits for Unit 56 are not valid within the Sandhill Demonstration Area. The daily bag limit on squirrels shall be the same as for the remainder of Wood County.


