ORDER OF THE

DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRY, LABOR & HUMAN RELATIONS

Pursuant to authority vested in the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations by section 101.01 to 101.29, Wis. Stats., the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations hereby creates and adopts the following rule of Wisconsin Administrative Code Ind 55.39.

The rule shall become effective on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin Administrative Code as provided in Section 227.

Section Ind 55.39 is created to read:

Ind 55.39 Use of "safety-base" film.

- (1) The requirements of sections Ind 55.40 through 55.49 will not apply in buildings in which movie projectors are used with "safety-base" film provided the conditions of (a) and (b) in this subsection are met.
 - (a) The owner shall submit an affidavit to the

 Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations
 stating that "safety-base" film only will be used in
 all movie projectors.
 - (b) The affidavit shall be signed by the owner and the signature notarized.

NOTE: For definition of "owner" see section 101.01 (13) of the Wisconsin Statutes.
