NR 10.02 Wild animals protected at all times. (1) There shall be no open season on Canada lynx, timber wolf, badger, moose, elk, marten, fisher, wolverine, flying squirrel, or white deer. White deer are only those deer which are monocolored white. Partially white deer are not included in the protected classification.


SECTION 5. NR 10.06 (3) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

NR 10.06 (3) It shall be unlawful for any person to hunt or shoot any deer and bear during the open season on any day during the open season before the time listed in the a.m. column, and after the time listed in the p.m. column in the following table:

SECTION 6. NR 10.24 (1) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read: NR 10.24 Deer Management Units (1) Deer management units are established as designated on the following map entitled "Deer Management Units" (revised 1972). (See foldout map on following page.)



SECTION 7. NR 16.02 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed and recreated to read:

NR 16.02 Game Farms. (1) Application. This section applies to game farms as provided in section 29.574 Wis. Stats. Game farm licenses may be issued only when the hunting and killing of animals and birds with weapons in the licensed area will be restricted to those species listed in subsection 29.01 (3), (b), (c) and (d), Wis. Statutes.

(2) Game Farm Fence Specifications. Game bird and animal farm fence construction, replacement or repairs shall comply with the following minimum specifications: (a) unless otherwise provided in this section, the area to be included within the licensed game bird and animal farm shall be enclosed with a woven wire fence not lighter than 20-gauge wire with mesh not larger than 2 inches. Such fence shall be not less than 47 inches high of which 6 inches may be laid in or upon the ground in a manner to prevent the passage of game at ground level. (b) Game bird and animal farms licensed solely for mallard shooting shall be enclosed by a l strand wire fence. (c) Fence specifications for bear and other large animals shall be as defined in subsection NR 16.10 (ll). (d) Variation in fence construction other than specified shall be submitted to the Department of Natural Resources Secretary and may be approved by the Secretary if found to comply with the intent and purpose of these rules.

(3) Tagging hand-reared game. Hand-reared mallard ducks shall not be held or released for hunting purposes within the boundaries of a licensed game bird and animal farm unless the hind toe on the right foot has been removed prior to the bird reaching 4 weeks of age.

SECTION 8. NR 16.04 of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

SECTION 9. NR 19.07 (2) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read: NR 19.07 (2) The season for taking pheasants on shooting preserves shall begin September 15 and shall end on the last day of February. Shooting hours shall be as provided in Wisconsin Administrative Code section NR 10.06.

SECTION 10. NR 19.07 (5) is amended to read:

NR 19.07 (5) Size and Location of Areas. No shooting preserve license shall be issued after the effective date of this section (December 1, 1959), other than for those already in operation, for any land area larger than 640 acres or smaller than 80 acres, or for any area less than one-quarter mile from the exterior boundaries of a planned or approved state or federal wildlife area, public hunting ground or refuge which is managed in whole or in part for pheasants. All lands under one license shall be contiguous.

SECTION 11. NR 19.07 (6) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

NR 19.07 (6) Investigation Before Licensing. The Department shall make such investigations necessary to determine that all provisions of section 29.573, Wis. Stats., and this section are complied with. All licenses are subject to the approval of the Secretary and investigations for new licenses will be made only during the period beginning January 1 and ending August 31 of each year.

SECTION 12. NR 19.07 (8)(b) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

NR 19.07 (8)(b) All pheasants liberated shall be of high-quality stock, fully feathered, and not less than 12 weeks of age. For the purpose of assuring highquality stock, pheasants shall not be debeaked more than 1/4 inch and not less than 2 weeks prior to release. Brailed pheasants shall have the brail removed not less than 2 weeks prior to release. Pheasants shall not be held in crates or other containers more than 24 hours prior to release. Upon written certification by the department representative, listing the number and varieties of pheasants stocked, or placed in holding pens (see (e) below) and the date of such stocking or holding, shooting preserve seals shall be furnished by the department at a cost of 5 cents each to the licensee at a ratio of 75% of the total birds certified. All shooting preserve seals and seal credits shall expire on March 1.

SECTION 13. NR 19.07 (8)(c) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

NR 19.07 (8)(c) Upon leaving preserve no person shall have in his possession or under his control any dead pheasant or pheasants of any species or varieties showing indications that they have been shot, unless the proper shooting preserve seal has been attached. Such seals shall be supplied by the department at a cost of 5 cents each. This regulation will apply both during the general open season for pheasants and during the special pheasant season prescribed in this section for licensed shooting preserves.

SECTION 14. NR 19.07 (8)(e) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is amended to read:

NR 19.07 (8)(e) Any shooting preserve shall be authorized to retain and stock pheasants from an approved holding pen provided such birds have been counted and certified by a department representative. The licensee agrees to stock all pheasants so retained.

SECTION 15. NR 19.07 (9) of the Wisconsin Administrative Code is repealed.

The foregoing rules and regulations were approved at the July 27, 1972, meeting of the Natural Resources Board, and will take effect upon publication.
